
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CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of Q1 2023, the negative current account balance amounted to USD 1,476.0 million (45.0 percent of GDP) being influenced by an increase in the trade deficit and deterioration in the secondary income balance. At the same time, there was a decrease in the deficit of other items of the balance of payments' current account – the services balance and the primary income balance.

TRADE BALANCE¹

Considerable growth in imports amid slight rise in export volumes conditioned an increase in the trade deficit.

In Q1 2023, the negative trade balance of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices amounted to USD 1,706.5 million, having grown by 30.8 percent compared to Q1 2022.

In the reporting period, the foreign trade turnover in FOB prices exceeded the comparable indicator of Q1 2022 by 25.3 percent and amounted to USD 2,576.6 million.

Export of goods in FOB prices amounted to USD 435.1 million. Export of goods excluding gold increased by 2.3 percent compared to Q1 2022 and amounted to USD 384.8 million.

At the end of Q1 2023, **import of goods** in FOB prices expanded by 27.4 percent compared to the corresponding indicator for the same period of 2022 and amounted to USD 2,141.6 million.

STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE²

Exports of goods in FOB prices, excluding the National Bank's adjustments in accordance with the balance of payments methodology, amounted to USD 436.3 million. Exports excluding gold amounted to USD 386.0 million, having grown by 2.7 percent compared to Q1 2022.

In the reporting period, the functional structure of exports demonstrated an enlargement in all items of functional distribution, excluding consumer goods and energy products. Consumer goods (35.4 percent of total exports) and intermediate goods (35.1 percent) were the largest categories of exports, meanwhile the share of raw materials was 14.0 percent, and the aggregate share of energy products and investment goods was 15.4 percent.

Export of consumer goods declined by 3.0 percent and amounted to USD 154.6 million. Exports was mainly provided by supplies of motor cars and vehicles for the transport of persons (growth by 4.8 times), articles for the conveyance or packing of goods (by 68.1 percent), cereal preparations and preparations of flour or starch (by 39.1 percent), as well as butter and other fats (by 4.3 times). Simultaneously, there was a reduction in exports of fresh or frozen vegetables (by 48.7 percent), clothes (by 14.7 percent), and live animals (by 44.5 percent).

The value of intermediate goods exports rose by 17.7 percent and amounted to USD 153.3 million, primarily due to an aggrandizement in gold supplies.

The total export of raw materials increased by 67.3 percent compared to Q1 2022 and amounted to USD 61.3 million largely because of the growth in the supplies of ore and precious metal concentrates (by 68.3 percent). Meanwhile, there was a decline in exports of cotton (by 48.8 percent).

Export of energy products fell by 5.8 percent compared to Q1 2022 and amounted to USD 38.4 million. The decline was owing to a substantial reduction in export of kerosene³ (by 37.9 percent) and fuel oil (by 39.4 percent). However, there was a rise in export of coal, coke and briquettes (by 2.5 times) and lubricating petroleum oil (by 4.3 times).

In the reporting period, export of investment goods escalated by 3.1 times and amounted to USD 28.7 million. Growth was observed in the supplies of telephone sets (by 26.3 percent) and automatic data-processing machines and their components (by 6.2 times). Whereas, there was a drop in the supplies of other internal combustion engines with compression ignition (in a considerable volume).

As in Q1 2022, the share of the EAEU countries prevailed **in the geographical structure of exports** (53.7 percent). The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mostly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of aforementioned goods was supplied to Russia (50.1 percent) and Kazakhstan (47.2 percent).

The aggregate share of the non-EAEU countries in the total export of goods respectively amounted to 46.3 percent. In the reporting period, the largest volume of goods was exported to Uzbekistan, Switzerland and Türkiye (in total 60.5 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

According to the results of Q1 2023, **import of goods** in CIF prices went up by 27.7 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and amounted to USD 2,295.3 million.

In the functional structure of imports for Q1 2023, supply of intermediate and investment goods boosted the most. Changed terms of trade had led to a rise in the share of intermediate goods in the total volume of imports up to 42.3 percent and investment goods – up to 19.2 percent, meanwhile the proportion of consumer goods fell down to 30.1 percent and the share of energy products more than halved, down to 6.4 percent. The share of raw materials is still low and practically unchanged at the level of 2.0 percent.

According to the results of the reporting period, import of intermediate goods surged by 75.9 percent and amounted to USD 970.9 million. Supplies were provided by knitted or crocheted fabrics (growth by 3.0 times), cast iron and steel (by 19.5 percent), fabrics from man-made materials (by 77.2 percent), parts and accessories of the motor vehicles (by 78.5 percent). In addition, there was a reduction in import of sewing-machines needles, parts for the machines and furniture (by 57.6 percent), plastics (by 27.8 percent).

In Q1 2023, import of consumer goods advanced by 2.6 percent and amounted to USD 691.7 million. There was an increase in import of motor cars and vehicles for the transport of persons (gain by 6.6 times), fresh or dried fruits and nuts (by 2.0 times), essential oils, cleaning preparations (by 21.2 percent). On the other hand, there was a decline in import of clothes (by 70.3 percent) and footwear (by 49.0 percent).

In the reporting period, import of investment goods went up by 73.7 percent and amounted to USD 439.8 million. According to the commodity structure of the category under consideration, the serious increase was observed in import of locksmith's equipment, safes and hardware (by 84.6 percent), telephone sets (by 92.7 percent), automatic data-processing machines and their components (by 8.4 times). Besides, there was a cut-down in import of internal combustion piston engines for vehicles (by 54.1 percent).

According to the results of Q1 2023, import of energy products declined by 48.2 percent and amounted to USD 146.5 million. This dynamics was basically the result of a reduction by 60.3 percent in the value of imported petroleum products, down to USD 88.7 million, the share thereof in this group of goods was 60.5 percent. There was a drop in import of gasoline (by 65.1 percent), gas oil (by 70.2 percent) and kerosene (by 53.3 percent), meanwhile supplies of lubricants grew by 59.1 percent.

Import of raw materials cultivated by 33.0 percent compared to Q1 2022 and amounted to USD 46.3 million. There was a growth particularly in the supplies of unmilled cereals and mangcorn (by 22.3 percent), metal salts and peroxy salts of inorganic acids (by 18.5 percent).

In the reporting period, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries fell down to 26.1 percent (38.6 percent in Q1 2022) **in the geographic structure of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, is also imported from these countries.

According to the results of Q1 2023, the share of the non-EAEU countries advanced significantly compared to the same period in 2022 (61.4 percent) and amounted to 73.9 percent respectively. The upward dynamics of import from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of intermediate and consumer goods. China remains the largest trading partner with the share of 56.6 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In Q1 2023, goods were also supplied from Türkiye (7.5 percent), Republic of Korea (4.9 percent) and the USA (4.5 percent).



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The growth of services provided to the foreign citizens in the Kyrgyz Republic improved the negative balance of the international services.

According to the results of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative in the amount of USD 25.6 million, having decreased by 61.1 percent compared to Q1 2022. The export of services expanded by 3.1 times and amounted to USD 503.8 million, the import of services enlarged by 2.3 times and amounted to USD 529.3 million.

In the reporting period, as before, the defining items of services were “travels” and “transport services”, which in total constituted 77.8 percent of the international services turnover.

In the reporting period, the balance of transport services was traditionally formed negative and amounted to USD 125.2 million, having increased by 34.8 percent compared to the same period in 2022. This dynamics was conditioned by outstripping growth in import of transport services compared to their exports: imports went up by USD 78.9 million or 49.9 percent primarily owing to railway transport services, meanwhile exports upsized by USD 46.6 million or 71.4 percent, generally because of air and automobile transport services.

The balance of the item “travels” was formed positive in the amount of USD 154.3 million, having advanced by 3.7 times compared to Q1 2022. In the reporting period, the total volume of services related to the trips of the foreign citizens to the Kyrgyz Republic (export of services) rose by 4.8 times and amounted to USD 304.5 million. This growth was primarily conditioned by crucial enhancement in the tourist flow particularly from the neighboring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) increased by 6.8 times and amounted to USD 150.2 million.

The balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” was formed negative, having risen by 3.5 times compared to the same period of 2022 and amounted to USD 49.5 million. Growth on this item was observed in both directions - exports and imports, which was a result of the progressive global demand for the formation of tours and trips, including the development of the tourism and travel industry in the Kyrgyz Republic. Thus, exports came up by 2.4 times (up to USD 26.3 million) compared to the same period of 2022, and imports advanced by 3.0 times (up to USD 75.8 million).

BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

In the reporting period, there was change in the volume of non-residents' incomes received from direct investments to determine dynamics of the item "primary income".

According to the results of Q1 2023, the balance of the item "**primary income**" was formed negative in the amount of USD 115.3 million, having fallen by 38.0 percent compared to the same indicator in Q1 2022. This dynamics was primarily conditioned by growth up to USD 79.8 million in the volume of resident companies' reinvested income received by the foreign investors. The volume of accrued dividends payable grew up by 3.4 times and amounted to USD 21.3 million. As a result, the balance of investment income on direct investments was formed negative in the amount of USD 102.1 million, having declined by 35.5 percent compared to the level of income payable in Q1 2022.

The volume of accrued interest payable on external debt obligations of the public and private sectors amounted to USD 32.6 million. Interest receivable on other investments rose by 5.6 times compared to the same indicator in 2022 and amounted to USD 20.0 million. As a result, the net volume of accrued interest payable on the item "other investments" declined by 51.6 percent compared to Q1 2022 and amounted to USD 12.5 million.

In the reporting period, the balance of the item "labor remuneration" was formed negative in the amount of USD 0.6 million, having fallen by 68.6 percent as a result of a reduction in the total volume income of the non-residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

Cut-down in net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item "secondary income".

At the end of Q1 2023, positive balance of **secondary income** amounted to USD 371.4 million, having gone down by 19.9 percent through a decline by 18.2 percent in private transfer receipts, down to USD 372.4 million.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, almost the entire volume of receipts was provided by money transfers of individuals. In the reporting period, the gross inflow of money transfers declined by 6.0 percent, and outflow became larger by 39.9 percent. As a result, the net inflow fell by 17.8 percent compared to 2022 and amounted to USD 368.3 million.



The share of postal and private transfers between the individuals through the bank accounts remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. The results of the reporting period showed that the main share of remittances was mainly received from the Russian Federation (89.9 percent). Besides, the weighty share of remittances also falls on the Russian Federation (65.6 percent).

The results of Q1 2023 evidenced that, net inflow of remittances in the amount of USD 368.3 million was insufficient to cover net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the amount of USD 537.2 million.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the capital account was formed positive to a large extent as a consequence of the capital transfers inflow.

At the end of Q1 2023, **the capital account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 35.2 million thanks to net inflows of public sector's capital transfers in the amount of USD 27.0 million from abroad.

As before, funds are transferred to the country mainly through the money transfer systems⁴. More than 90 percent of all remittances inflow to the country are provided by these systems. At the end of Q1 2023, the gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems declined by 9.7 percent compared to 2022 and amounted to USD 467.9 million⁵. The volume of remittances outflow from the country grew by 35.0 percent and amounted to USD 149.6 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money transfer systems fell by 21.8 percent and amounted to USD 318.3 million.



FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the financial account was formed positive primarily owing to the dynamics of other investments.

According to the results of Q1 2023, net lending to the rest of the world, presented in the financial account (analytical representation of the balance of payments), amounted to USD 128.5 million, meanwhile in the same period of 2022, there was net borrowing in the amount of USD 167.2 million. In the reporting period, the financial account, as before, experienced major impact of other and direct investments.

In Q1 2023, foreign economic operations on the item “other investments” provided net lending to the rest of the world in

the amount of USD 196.0 million, meanwhile, in Q1 2022, there was net borrowing from the rest of the world in the amount of USD 177.4 million. In the reporting period, the dynamics of other investments was primarily determined by the net incurrence of liabilities, which was formed with a negative balance in the amount of USD 172.8 million. The negative balance of net incurrence of liabilities was principally a result of lowering of other sectors’ debts on trade credits and advances by USD 171.4 million (in contrast, in the same period of 2022, there was an enlargement in liabilities on trade credits and advances by USD 76.9 million). In addition, there was a reduction in liabilities on loans and borrowings of all sectors of the economy by USD 51.0 million, basically because of the excess of payments on the principal amount of debt over the volume of credits received by the public and private sectors (in Q1 2022, liabilities on loans and borrowings rose by USD 33.4 million). Contemporaneously, liabilities of the commercial banks in the form of cash currency and deposits in foreign accounts grew by USD 49.5 million.

The assets of the residents outside the Kyrgyz Republic went up by USD 23.2 million (in Q1 2022, assets fell by USD 67.6 million) as a result of substantial increase in the total amount of currency and deposits of the resident banks abroad by USD 123.6 million. In contrast, the trade credits and advances of private sector were reduced by USD 100.5 million due to the excess of credits extended to non-resident companies over the amount of funds received from their repayment (assets). As of the end of Q1 2023, the prevailing volume of enterprises’ accounts receivable fell on the wholesale and retail trade, processing industry, as well as institutions engaged in the professional, scientific and technical activity.

In the reporting period, the negative balance on direct investments amounted to USD 75.1 million (net borrowing), which was predominantly conditioned by growth in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents in the amount of USD 80.4 million through receipt of USD 79.8 million of reinvested earnings.

In the sectoral structure, the main volume of foreign direct investment net inflows went to the enterprises of processing industries (USD 29.9 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 26.7 million), professional, scientific and technical activity (USD 8.0 million), as well as mining (USD 6.3 million). However, there was net outflow from the sectors of arts, entertainment and recreation (USD 3.8 million) and the enterprises engaged in construction (USD 1.6 million).

The balance of the item “errors and omissions”, taking into account the additional estimates of the National Bank, was formed positive in the amount of USD 1,243.3 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of Q1 2023 amounted to USD 2,489.7 million, which covers 2.6 months⁶ of future imports of goods and services.

Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices




Table I.34. Geographic Distribution of Net Inflows of Foreign Direct Investments in the Kyrgyz Republic*
