EDITORIAL
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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The legislative basis for the balance of payments are the Law of the Kyrgyz Republic as of July 29, 1997 No. 59 "On the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic" and the Resolution of the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic as of November 3, 2000 No. 645 "On measures to improve statistics of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic". This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

This publication provides the revised data on direct investments for 2015. Moreover, starting from the publication for the first quarter of 2016:

- the data on the foreign trade operations comprise additional estimates of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic for exports;***
- the data on the international reserves of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic were revised according to the IMF methodology, thereunder only the assets in convertible currencies were included in the international reserve assets. The assets in other currencies were presented as other assets in "other investments" item;***
- the reference period, which is used for calculation of the REER (real effective exchange rate) index, was revised;***
- preliminary version of the analytical form of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled on the basis of BPM 6 methodology was provided.***

Last day for update of data for the present publication is January 20, 2017.

Annotation symbols and notes:

- ... means the absence of data;
- means, that indicators/ratios are equal to 0 (zero) or insignificant;
- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

Deviations in last digits may occur because of rounding numbers when summing up.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as "open period".

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Other publications of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

Annual Report of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

This document is an overall report of the National Bank for the last year. It includes summary on economic development of the republic and monetary policy, as well as the National Bank financial statements, general information and statistical reviews. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Bulletin of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

Informational publication includes statistical data on the basic macroeconomic indicators and economy sectors of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Monetary Policy Report (Inflation Report of the Kyrgyz Republic)

This publication describes dynamics of consumer prices in the republic and regions, analysis of the main inflation factors, informs about the National Bank decisions on monetary policy and provides with inflation preview for the forthcoming period. It is published quarterly in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Report on Stability of the Financial Sector of the Kyrgyz Republic

The report reflects the NBKR's evaluation of foreign and domestic economic factors influencing the financial stability, the conditions of banks and other financial intermediate institutions, as well as the analysis of the current state of affairs in the financial markets and the stability of financial sector of Kyrgyzstan. It is published twice a year in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

The purpose of the document is to publish statutory acts of the National Bank in order to provide commercial banks and public with statutory acts and official information on the National Bank activity, as well as propaganda of the Kyrgyz Republic banking legislation. Presumable publication frequency is once a month in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

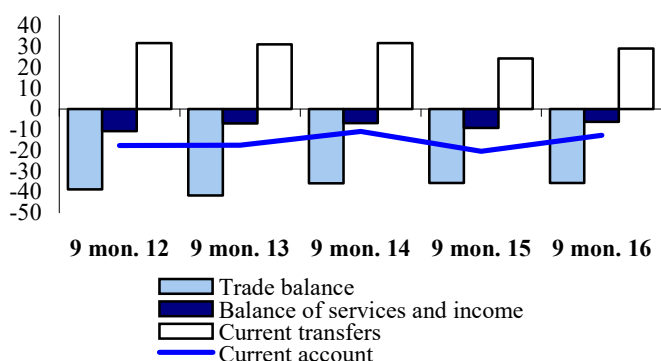
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CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percents to GDP)



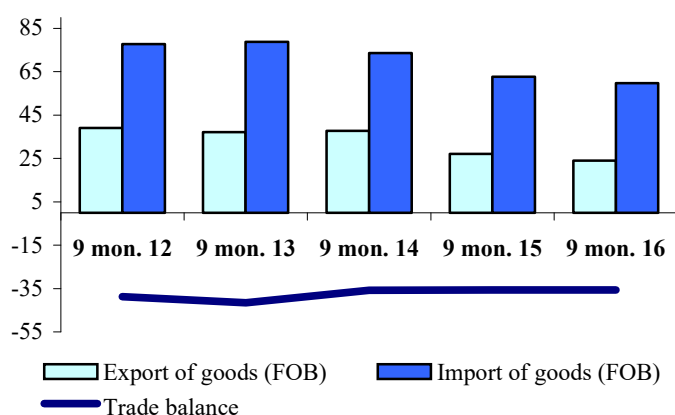
Following 9 months of 2016 the current account¹ had negative balance and made 678.0 million of USD (decrease by 23.1 percent) or 12.6 percent to GDP². The reduction of deficit of the current account is caused by improvement of balance of services and income, as well as by positive dynamics in current transfers.

TRADE BALANCE

The increase in deficit of trade balance at the end of 9 months of 2016 was defined by the outperformance of export decline by contrast to reduction of import of goods.

Under the conditions of advancing decrease in volume of export of goods by contrast to import, the negative **trade balance**¹ of the Kyrgyz Republic in the FOB prices in January-September 2016 amounted to 1,721.6 million USD, having increased by 3.4 percent as compared with the indicator of the same period of 2015. At the same time, the indicator's ratio to GDP in the reporting period amounted to 35.7 percent.

Foreign trade turnover in the FOB prices decreased by 3.7 percent as compared with January-September 2015 and made around 3,775.7 million USD.

Export of goods in the FOB prices amounted to 1,027.0 million USD, having

reduced by 8.9 percent as compared with the indicator of January-September 2015. **Export excluding gold** for the reporting period amounted to 581.4 million USD, having reduced by 4.7 percent as compared with the corresponding indicator of 2015.

Export excluding gold and additional estimates of the National Bank increased by 8.9 percent and made 540.7 million USD.

Despite the decrease of the volume in the structure of exports in January-September 2016, the products **of the processing industry** made the main share in the total cost of supply, as before, from which more than 50.0 percent were the export products **of metallurgical and clothing production**. The most essential decrease in their structure is observed on gold export.

The decrease in production volumes of main metals and finished metal goods (by 10.8 percent) in January-September 2016 by contrast with January-September 2015 is caused by considerable reduction of precious metals³ production. As a result the exports of gold decreased by 14.0 percent⁴. The reduction of exports of gold regarding 9 months of 2015 was caused by the reduction of exports of gold by 18.7 percent in physical expression, meanwhile the export prices increased by 5.9 percent⁵. In general, the decrease in the volume is observed on all goods items of the group, except for "Iron and steel" that increased by 9.0 million USD.

The 22.4 percent reduction of volumes of textile production and clothing manufacture is caused by the decline in output of men and women's apparel, as well as in textile products⁶. Despite this fact, the total volume of exports of apparel and clothing accessories increased by 17.0 percent. The growth is caused mainly by the export of apparel for men due to the simultaneous increase in prices and growth of physical volume of their exports.

The growth of gross output volumes of agricultural products in January-September 2016 is caused by the increase in both crop production and livestock production. At the same time, the growth of exports volume was observed only on the main products of crop production. The exports of vegetable was the largest, having increased by 30.1 million USD. At the same time, the growth of export contract prices influenced on the increase in the volume of the item "Fruit and nuts". The reduction of export volume of livestock production is caused mainly by the decrease in supply of milk and live animals.

In geographical structure of export of goods, the non-EAEU countries prevailed with the share of 74.5 percent in total volume of export (excluding export of gold the share of the non-EAEU countries made 29.4 percent). Despite the decrease of its share to 39.6 percent, Switzerland remained the major trade partner. Turkey and the United Arab Emirates were the other significant trade partners among the non-EAEU countries. Precious metals and agricultural products were the main items supplied to these countries.

The total share of the EAEU countries in the total volume of export of goods decreased from 27.6 to 25.5 percent. The products of the textile industry and the agricultural industry represent the export commodity structure to the EAEU countries. In view of certain EAEU countries, the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan are the main consumers of domestic export.

Following January-September 2016, the **import of goods** in the FOB prices amounted to 2,748.6 million USD and decreased by 1.6 percent as compared with the similar indicator of 2015.

In January-September 2016, the supply of oil products had the highest rates of reduction **in the import commodity structure**. As a result, the import of oil products for the reporting period decreased by 50.5 percent up to 260.5 million USD, mainly due to the reduction of supply of gasoline and diesel fuel. The reduction of import volume of oil products was due to the decrease in contract prices by 37.6 percent and physical volumes by 20.7 percent.

Import of machinery and transport equipment⁷ increased by 2.3 percent and made 612.7 million USD. In commodity structure, the increase in supply was observed in the items "electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy", "parts and accessories of the motor vehicles" etc. It should be noted that part of goods of this group is partially imported for the subsequent re-export.

Import of miscellaneous manufactured articles increased by 271.8 million USD up to 563.1 million USD. The import of apparel and clothing accessories and footwear from China (their cost made 399.3 million USD) made more than 70.0 percent of this growth. The increase of volumes of import is observed practically on all main imported goods items of the section.

Import of the manufactured goods classified chiefly by material amounted to the level of the same period of 2015. The items "Iron and steel" and "Woven fabrics of man-made textile materials" caused considerable changes in commodity structure of the section.

In general, the decrease in the volume for the majority of goods of this group was observed due to the reduction of both physical volume of import and import prices.

The share of the non-EAEU countries increased from 49.6 to 60.7 percent (to 1,774.1 million USD) in **geographical distribution** of import due to the increase in supply of consumer goods. China remains the key trade partner of the Kyrgyz Republic among foreign countries. The share of China in the reporting period is about 62.0 percent of all import volume from the non-EAEU countries.

The share of the EAEU countries in total volume of import made 39.3 percent. The petroleum products still have the main share of import from the EAEU countries in the reporting period. The Russian Federation was the prime supplier of oil products. In addition to oil products, a growth of supply of a number of consumer goods from the EAEU countries was also observed.

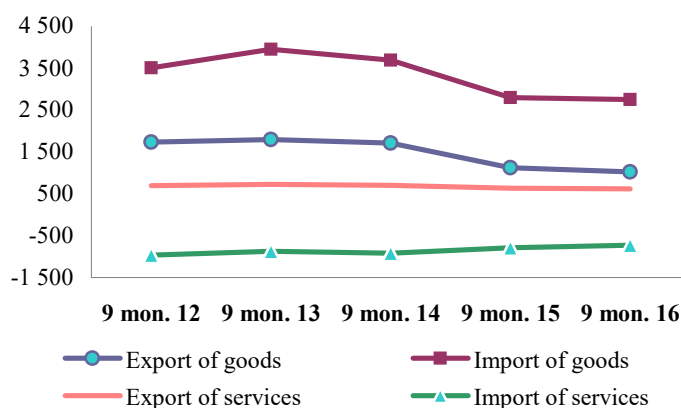

BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The decrease in deficit of balance of international services was caused by more considerable decrease in import of services as compared with the reduction of export of services.

Chart 3. External service and goods trade*

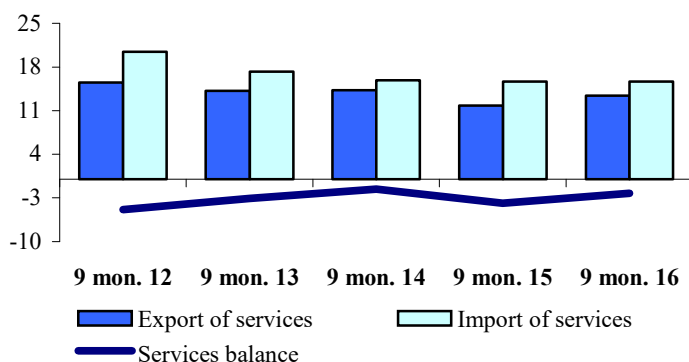

At the same time, the reduction of export of transport services by 9.9 percent (due to decrease in rail transport services) was observed, meanwhile the reduction of import made 13.9 percent (also due to rail transport services). One of the factors, which influenced on the decrease in import of rail transport services, is the reduction of volumes of import of the used motor vehicles due to changes of import terms. It should be noted that the used motor vehicles are imported to the country mainly by rail transport.

For the reporting period, the net export of business services slightly increased and had positive balance of 16.4 million USD. The change of volume of consulting services became the major factor, which influenced on the change of import and export of business services in the reporting period.

INCOME

In the reporting period, dynamics of the item "Income" was determined mainly by change of volume of direct investment income.

Following January-September 2016, the turnover of international services decreased by 5.2 percent and made 1,347.0 million USD.

The balance of international services was negative and made 111.3 million USD by contrast to 157.6 million USD in the corresponding period of 2015. At the same time, the import of services decreased by 7.6 percent, meanwhile the volume of services rendered by residents of the Kyrgyz Republic to non residents reduced by 2.2 percent.

In the reporting period, the **export of services** made 617.8 million USD that corresponds to 60.2 percent of the volume of export of goods. **The import of services** made 729.1 million USD that was 26.5 percent of import of goods.

In the reporting period, as before, the items "trips", "transport and business services" became the defining items of services, accounting for 81.0 percent of turnover of international services in total.

At the end of the reporting period, the balance of the item "trips" was positive of 3.9 million USD that is 88.9 percent less than in 2015.

In the reporting period, the balance of "transport services" was negative and made 168.9 million USD that is 16.5 percent less as compared with the similar indicator of nine

In January-September 2016, the balance of the item "Income" was negative of 237.3 million USD that is 5.7 percent less than the similar indicator in 2015. Generally, this tendency is caused by reduction of volumes of reinvested profit of enterprises from 189.6 million to 46.0 million USD. The volume of distributed income of the resident companies in the form of dividends for benefit of foreign direct investors increased and made 133.6 million USD.

In the reporting period, the volume of interest payments on earlier provided credits reduced slightly and made 53.7 million USD. In January-September 2016, the volume of income on other investments gained by residents of the country reduced and made 8.3 million USD. As a result, the negative balance of the item "Income on other investments" slightly increased (up to 45.4 million USD).

Following January-September 2016, the balance of the item "compensation of employees" was negative of 12.3 million USD and decreased by 11.8 percent due to the reduction of total volume of income of non residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

TRANSFERS

The volume of inflows under the item "Current transfers" increased due to the growth of net inflow of migrant workers' remittances.

Following nine months of 2016, the positive balance of **current transfers** made 1,392.3 million USD, having increased by 16.7 percent as compared with the level in 2015.

The **transfers of individuals** had the main influence on the current transfers account (other sectors), the net inflow of which increased by 18.3 percent.

In structure of transfers of individuals, as before, the workers' remittances have the defining role, the share of which, in the gross volume of inflows of individuals' transfers makes 95.3 percent. Following nine months of 2016, the increase in net inflow of remittances was caused by growth of their gross inflow by 15.6 percent, meanwhile the outflow of remittances decreased by 0.9 percent.

Remittances remain the main source of financing of trade deficit. The balance of remittances still covers the net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, had negative value of 949.4 million USD.

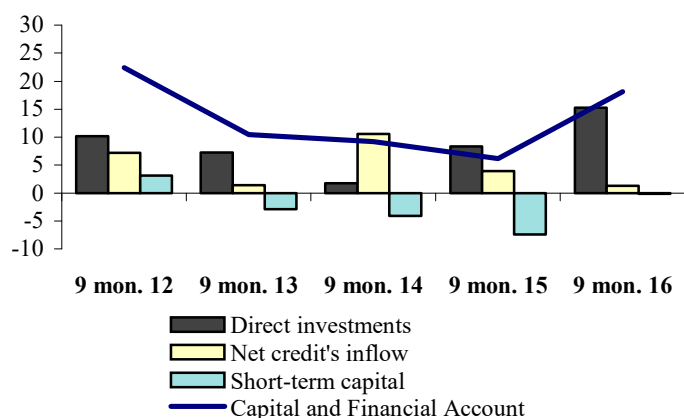
In January-September 2016, the balance of current transfers **of public administration sector** was positive of 48.3 million USD that is 15.7 percent less than the corresponding indicator in 2015. The reduction of inflows of official transfers was caused by the decrease in the volume of monetary grants received by public sector.

CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The increase in positive balance of capital and financial account was caused by the recovery of net inflow under the item "Other investments".

The money transfer systems⁸ remain the main method of migrant workers' remittances to the republic. In January-September 2016, the net volume of funds received through money transfer systems made 1,206.9 million USD⁹ that is 19.6 percent more than the similar indicator in 2015. The geographical structure of remittances remains practically unchanged. Following the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (97.2 percent). In the structure of transfers from the Kyrgyz Republic, the Russian Federation has also the prevailing share (98.9 percent).

Following nine months of 2016, **the capital and financial account** had positive balance of 514.7 million USD that is 343.5 million USD more than the corresponding indicator of the same period in 2015.

The balance **of capital account** was positive of 89.1 million USD that is 30.1 million USD more than the level in January-September 2015. The increase in indicators of the reporting period is caused mainly by the debt forgiveness of 30 million USD¹⁰ by the Russian Federation. In addition, the increase in inflows of grant funds within the program of state investments for 8.6 million USD was observed.

Following nine months of 2016, **the financial account** had positive balance of 425.7 million USD that is 313.4 million USD more than in January-September 2015. The inflow under the items "Direct foreign investments" and "Other investments" had main influence on the financial account.

At the end of nine months of 2016, the net volume of funds raised to the republic under the item "Other investments" made 86.2 million USD. The decrease in foreign assets of residents abroad influenced on forming of positive balance of this item.

In the reporting period, the residents' assets decreased by 139.1 million USD against their growth by 213.3 million USD in the same period of 2015. Meanwhile, the decrease in accounts receivable by 15.7 million USD is observed. As of the end of September 2016, more than 65.4 percent of gross volume of accounts receivable in total account for the share of enterprises of processing industry and institutions in the field of electricity and gas supply, as well as enterprises of wholesale and retail trade.

In the reporting period, the reduction of country residents' liabilities associated with the reduction of gross inflow of credits to private sector (by 111.4 million USD) was noticed. At the same time, the growth tendency of service on previously received loans remains. They increased by 49.9 percent as compared with the same period. Meanwhile, the growth of net volume of public sector credits by 90.7 million USD is observed. As a result, in the reporting period, the net inflow of credits had negative balance and made 1.9 million USD.

In the reporting period, the volume of accounts payable of the resident enterprises decreased by 10.1 million USD. In general, the enterprises of processing industry, wholesale and retail trade, mineral extraction, information and communication, as well as electricity and gas supply, and construction occupy the prevailing specific weight in total amount of accounts payable, making 80.6 percent of total debt.

For the reporting period, the balance under the item "Direct investments"¹¹ was positive and made 337.1 million USD that is 13.3 percent less than the level of 9 months in 2015. This tendency was caused mainly by the decrease in transactions on direct investments of residents abroad by 72.2 percent. The decrease in the direct foreign investments to the country by 28.3 percent (to 374.0 million USD) was also noted. This decrease is connected with the reduction of equity investments by 55.7 percent.

In the reporting period, the largest net inflow of direct investments by types of economic activity was observed in the enterprises of processing industry, supply of electric power, gas, steam, as well as in the economic entities in the field of insurance, scientific and technical activities. In geographical structure of direct investments, the capital inflow from China and the Russian Federation prevails.

Following nine months of 2016, **the overall net balance of payments** was positive of 286.0 million USD.

The balance of the item "**Errors and omissions**" taking into account the National Bank additional estimates was positive of 449.3 million USD that testifies to the incomplete statistical accounting of transactions associated with the capital inflow to the country or export of goods and services.

As of September 30, 2016, the volume of the international reserve assets¹² covers 4.4¹³ months of future import of goods and services.

Table of the Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic according to the 6th Edition of the Balance of Payments and International Investment Position Manual

Currently, the balance of payments statistics is compiled by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in accordance with the requirements of the International Monetary Fund's Balance of Payments Manual, the fifth edition (IMF, 1993). However, in order to meet the new international standards, the National Bank takes measures on compiling the external sector statistics based on the IMF's new methods - the Balance of Payments Manual, the sixth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM 6).

This box provides the users with a preliminary version of the analytical form of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled on the basis of BPM 6 methodology.

Given that the BPM 6 maintains succession with the methodology of the fifth edition, the balance of payments statistics, which are based on the methods of the fifth edition, generally, remain comparable with the data compiled based on the new methods. At the same time, the meaning of the balance of payments accounts changed as some items of the balance of payments were regrouped in accordance with the BPM 6.

The presentation form of the balance of payments statistics, formerly based on the credit (plus) and debit (minus) entries was changed in the provisional version of the balance of payments. Credit and debit operations are registered with a sign "+" in the current account and the capital account. Meanwhile, the balance of the corresponding items (goods, services, primary income, and secondary income) is defined as a difference between the credit and debit.

The notions "net acquisition of financial assets" and "net incurrence of liabilities" are used instead of "assets" and "liabilities" in the financial account. Net acquisition of assets is equal to the increase in assets after deduction of the decrease in assets. Net incurrence of liabilities is equal to the increase of liabilities after deduction of the decrease in the liabilities. Change with a sign "+" indicates the increase in the assets or liabilities, and change with a sign "-" indicates the decrease in the assets or liabilities. In accordance with the fifth edition of the Balance of Payments Manual, the increase in the asset was registered with a sign "-", the decrease in the assets - with a sign "+".

Statistical discrepancies (the item "Errors and omissions") are obtained as a residual value that brings into balance the positive or negative balances resulting from summing the operations registered in the balance of payments. A positive value of statistical differences indicates the capital inflows into the country or export of goods, which are statistically unrecorded. A negative value indicates the capital outflows from the country or imports of goods, which are statistically unrecorded.

Full data compiling of the balance of payments and the international investment position in accordance with the BPM 6 methods shall be implemented in 2016-2017.

Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices

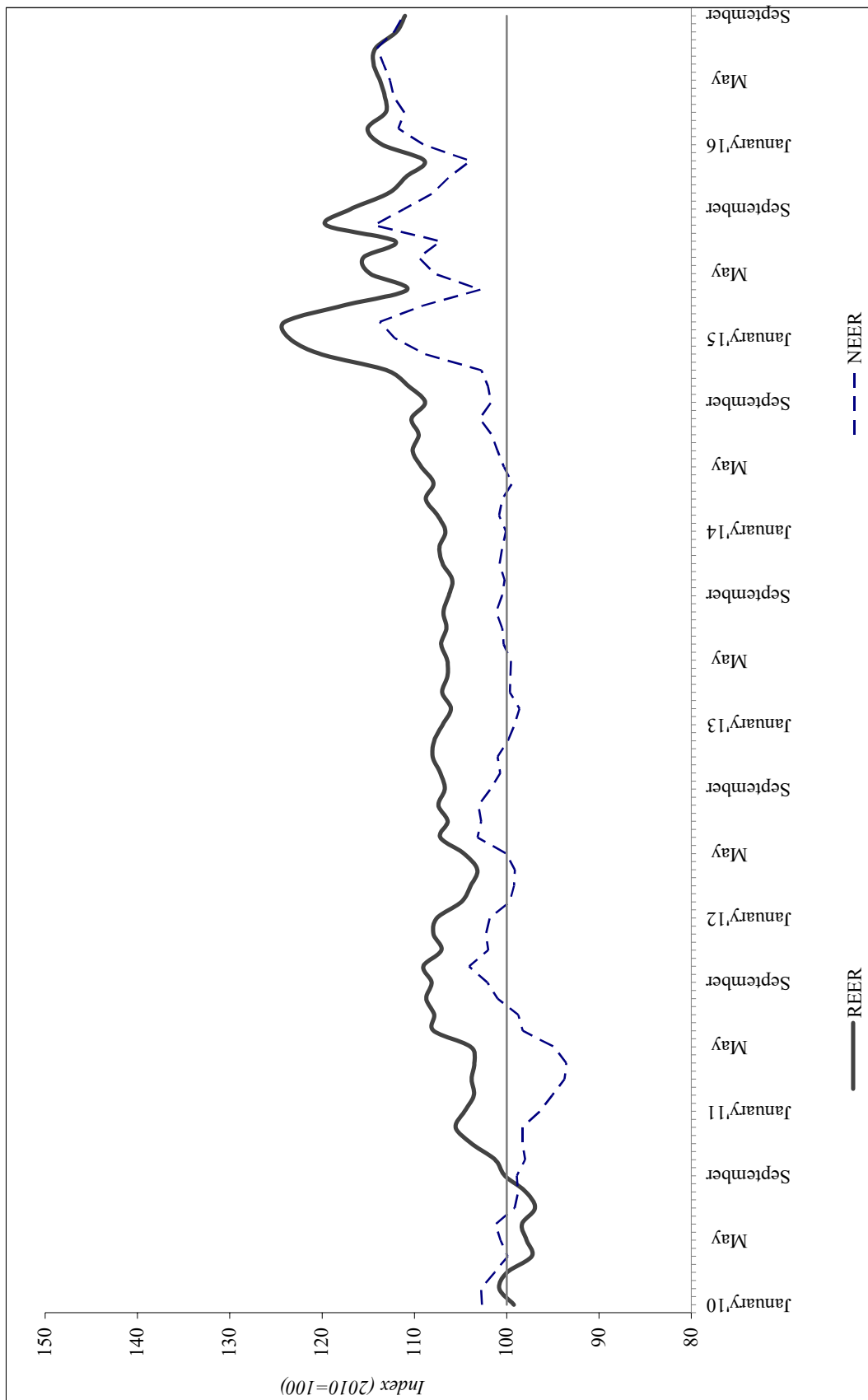
