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### ***Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic***

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year - in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

In the current issue international services data for the first quarter of 2009, private external debt data and direct investments data have been reviewed since 2006.

**Last day for update of data for the present publication is October 20, 2010.**

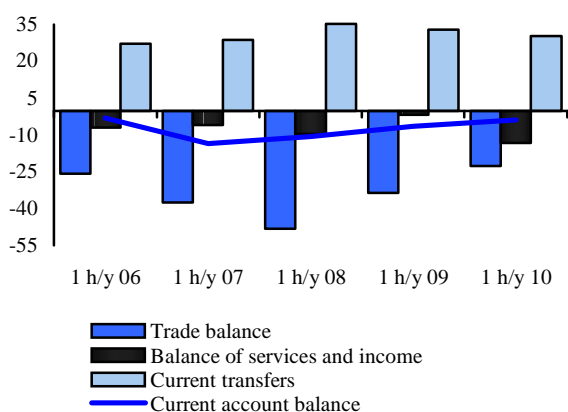
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## CURRENT ACCOUNT

As per results of the first half of 2010, **balance of payments** developed positive in the amount of US\$ 25.9 million.

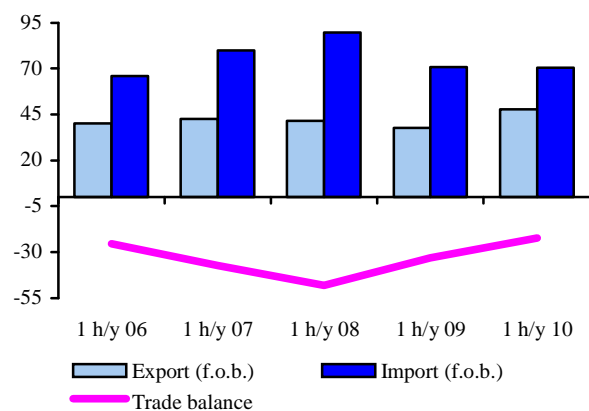
Deficit of **current account** balance constituted 3.7 percent of GDP or US\$ 94.4 million.

TRADE BALANCE<sup>1</sup>

Faster increment rates of export in comparison with increment rates of import provided decrease in deficit of **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in f.o.b. prices (with regard to additional estimations of the NSC and the NBKR) in the first half of 2010 by 30.8 percent to US\$ 404.9 million.

**External turnover** in f.o.b. prices (with regard to additional estimations of the NSC and the NBKR) increased by 12.0 percent and in value terms constituted US\$ 2 131.2 million. In greater degree, there was considerable increase in volume of trade turnover with non-CIS countries by 23.3 percent, whereas increase in trade turnover with the CIS countries constituted only 1.7 percent.

**Export of goods** in f.o.b. prices (with regard to additional estimations of the NSC and the NBKR) constituted US\$ 863.2 million, having increased by 31.0 percent. The main contribution into increase of the overall export was provided by gold, supplies of which increased in 2.2 times in the reporting period and constituted US\$ 361.3 million. Export exclusively of gold constituted US\$ 501.9 million, which was US\$ 4.6 million more than the corresponding index of the first half of 2009.

In the reporting period there was increase in all items of functional distribution of export, except for energy products. The largest export category was accounted for interim goods (52.0 percent from the aggregate export), raw materials (20.5 percent) and consumer goods (19.9 percent).

The share of energy products in the overall volume of export decreased by 10.4 percentage points and constituted 5.6 percent.

As for interim goods, there was increase by 93.1 percent. The main share of export in the considered category of goods was provided by gold supplies mainly to the UAE (63.6 percent from the aggregate export of gold) and to Switzerland (36.4 percent).

Growth of cost volume of gold export was provided due to increase in physical volume of supplies by 77.3 percent and price by 26.2 percent. As a result, the share of non-CIS countries in export of interim goods increased up to 94.7 percent.

Export of raw material increased by 4.7 percent and constituted US\$ 157.3 million. The main consumers of raw products were non-CIS countries (79.8 percent). The largest share of raw materials export (85.9 percent) was accounted for non-organic chemical substances, supplies of which increased by 15.7 percent in the reporting period. At the same time, within this functional category there was decrease in supply of cotton from US\$ 7.2 million to US\$ 2.4 million and tobacco from US\$ 11.1 million to US\$ 9.6 million due to reduction of physical volume of export.

Increase in supplies of clothes and accessories, filament lamps, vegetables, milk and dairy products, mineral waters and nonalcoholic beverages as well as increased re-export of telephone devices provided increase in export of consumer goods by 45.3 percent. As a result the total volume of consumer goods export constituted US\$ 152.6 million in the first half of 2010. Demand for consumer goods was mainly accounted for the CIS countries (87.0 percent).

Export of energy products decreased by 52.6 percent to US\$ 42.8 million. This tendency was provided by reduction of external demand for re-exported oil fuel as a result of prices increase. Thus, re-export of aviation kerosene in the reporting period decreased by 67.3 percent and constituted US\$ 24.9 million. In the first half of 2010, electric energy was exported in the amount of 108.8 million kWh, which in 2.2 times exceed the volume of supplies in the corresponding period of 2009. As a result the cost volume of electric energy reached the level of US\$ 3.5 million. According to geographic structure, the largest share of energy products (particularly oil products) was exported to non-CIS countries (64.0 percent).

In total volume of the Kyrgyz Republic export, the share of non-CIS countries constituted 72.2 percent and the share of CIS-countries constituted 27.8 percent correspondingly. The largest share of supplies was performed to the UAE (31.5 percent from the overall export), Switzerland (17.2 percent), Russia

(16.1 percent), USA (11.7 percent) and Kazakhstan (7.5 percent).

Export to the UAE in the reporting period increased from US\$ 4.8 million to US\$ 242.4 million, which was mainly provided by increased volume of gold export to this country. Moreover, re-export of aviation kerosene and telephone devices to this country also considerably increased. Supplies of non-organic chemical substances to the USA increased, which provided growth of export to this country from US\$ 10.1 million to US\$ 90.2 million. Export of goods to Russia increased by 47.5 percent and constituted US\$ 123.5 million. Trade structure of export to Russia was provided by the following basic goods: clothes and accessories, vegetables and fruits, filament lamps, tobacco, aviation kerosene, non-organic chemical substances. Supplies of gold to Switzerland decreased, which provided reduction of export to this country by 18.6 percent to US\$ 132.0 million. Growth of export of dairy products, electric energy, vegetables as well as non-organic chemical substances provided increase in supplies to Kazakhstan by 44.6 percent to the level of US\$ 57.8 million. In the reporting period export to Canada considerably increased (up to US\$ 9.6 million), which was mainly provided by supplies of non-organic chemical substances. In the reporting period, volume of export to Uzbekistan decreased from US\$ 80.5 million to US\$ 19.6 million, which was explained by considerable decrease in re-export of aviation kerosene. Due to decrease in supplies of non-organic chemical substances, export to France decreased from US\$ 111.2 million to US\$ 21.3 million.

In the first half of 2010, **import of goods** in f.o.b. prices increased by 1.9 percent and constituted US\$ 1 268.0 million.

In the reporting period, the import structure remained unchanged: as before the largest shares of imported goods were accounted for consumer goods (31.2



percent out of the total import), energy products (29.2 percent) and intermediate goods (21.7 percent)<sup>2</sup>.

Import of *consumer goods* increased by 1.8 percent and constituted US\$ 428.3 million. In goods structure of this category, the following main tendencies were observed: import of meat and meat products increased by US\$ 11.5 million, supplies of fruits and nuts increased by US\$ 4.4 million, sugar - by US\$ 4.1 million, medications - by US\$ 12.7 million, telephone devices - by US\$ 5.0 million; there was decrease in import of rice by US\$ 6.5 million, clothes and accessories by US\$ 3.6 million, shoes by US\$ 4.5 million, and automobiles by US\$ 7.3 million. The main suppliers of consumer goods were non-CIS countries (64.5 percent).

In the reporting period, import of *energy products* increased by 16.4 percent and constituted US\$ 400.5 million. Almost the whole volume of energy products supply (96.2 percent) was performed by the CIS-countries. Share of oil products in this category of goods constituted 87.3 percent. Due to introduction of export duty by Russia, there was considerable increase in prices for fuel and lubricants and reduction of natural volume of import. Cost volume of oil products export increased by 19.5 percent. Supplies of natural gas decreased by 29.0 percent and constituted US\$ 30.5 million. Import of coal in the reporting period increased in 2.2 times and amounted to US\$ 17.7 million.

Import of *interim goods* decreased by 5.1 percent and constituted US\$ 298.4 million. The largest share of interim goods (55.6 percent) was imported from non-CIS countries. When considering goods structure of this category, there was decrease in import of fabrics (by 27.1 percent), spare parts for automobiles (by 56.9 percent), crude iron and steel products (by 10.1 percent). There was increase in import of rubber tires (by 27.8 percent), fertilizers (in 2.3 times) and plastic materials in primary and non-primary forms (by 30.3 percent).

In accordance with the geographic structure, the CIS countries prevailed in import transactions with the share of 56.0 percent, whereas the share of non-CIS

countries constituted 44.0 percent correspondingly. The largest suppliers of imported goods were Russia (33.4 percent), China (17.9 percent) and Kazakhstan (12.3 percent).

Russian export decreased by 1.5 percent and in cost value constituted US\$ 459.0 million. In the goods structure, there was decrease in import of cereals, flour, starch, chocolate products, beer, wood, aviation kerosene, rubber tires, crude iron and steel and products made of them.

Supplies of goods from China decreased by 6.2 percent and constituted US\$ 245.5 million. Decrease in import was noted for such major products as fabrics, clothes, shoes, rice, crude iron and steel products. Positive tendency was registered for supplies of investment goods.

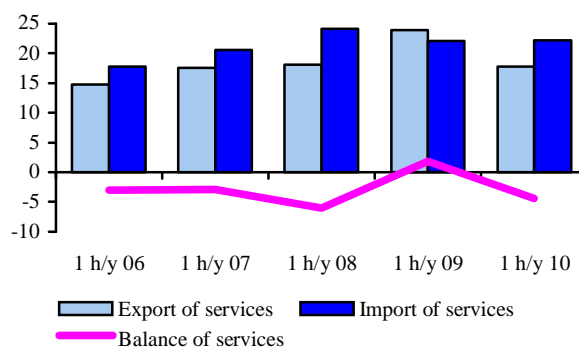
Import supplies from Kazakhstan increased by 7.8 percent and constituted US\$ 168.5 million. There was increase in supplies of oil products, coal and vegetable oil. Supplies of non-organic chemical substances, wheat and flour decreased.

## BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

**Turnover of international services** as per results of the first half of 2010 decreased by 10.6 percent and constituted US\$ 721.4 million.

In the first half of 2010, negative balance of international services amounted to US\$ 79.1 million whereas in the corresponding period of 2009 positive balance constituted US\$ 31.0 million. This index was formed as a result of decrease in export of services by 23.3 percent and increase in import of services by 3.2 percent.

As per results of the first half of 2010, **export of services** amounted to US\$ 321.1 million. Decrease of this index was mainly provided by reduction of services export on the item "travels"; thus from US\$ 97.8 million of total reduction of export of services, US\$ 85.5 million or 87.4 percent was accounted for travels.

During the period January-June 2010, export on the item "transportation services" constituted US\$ 66.2 million. This index increased by 7.2 percent in comparison with the first half of 2009, which was provided by increase in export of services, provided by air transportation in the reporting period by 15.3 percent, whereas on other type of transportation, there was export decrease. Share of export of transportation services in the overall export of services constituted 20.6 percent.

It should be noted that in the first half of 2010, there was decrease in export of financial, construction, business and other services by US\$ 24.8 million, whereas their summed share in the overall export of services constituted 31.7 percent.

In the first half of 2010, **import of services** increased from US\$ 387.9 million to US\$ 400.3 million. Growth of import of services by 3.2 percent was provided by changes, occurred in such considerable items of import of services as "transportation services", "travels", "business services" and "other services". Thus total growth on the item "travels" and "business services" constituted US\$ 19.9 million, whereas total decrease on transportation and other services constituted US\$ 18.0 million.

### INCOME

As per results of the first half of 2010, negative balance of income constituted US\$ 158.1 million, which was in 2.6 times more in comparison with the corresponding index of the first half of 2009.

Considerable increase in negative balance of this item was mainly provided by increase in re-invested income of direct foreign investors in 4.7 times, the volume of which amounted to US\$ 115.6 million.

Besides that, negative balance of income on other investments increased in 1.3 times and constituted US\$ 18.0 million.

At the same time, income of residents on portfolio investments abroad decreased from US\$ 3.6 million in the first half of 2009 to US\$ 0.2 million in the reporting period.

Negative balance of the item "compensation of employees" constituted US\$ 14.1 million, having increased by 13.3 percent in comparison with the corresponding index of the first half of 2009.

### TRANSFERS

As per results of the first half of 2010, balance of **current transfers** was positive in the amount of US\$ 547.7 million, which was by 5.8 percent less in comparison with the corresponding period of 2009.

In the first half of 2010, net inflow of current transfers to **general government sector** (standard presentation of balance of payment) constituted US\$ 40.7 million, which was by 75.4 percent less in comparison with the corresponding index of the first half of 2009. This decrease was provided by considerable decrease of volume of monetary grants, received by general government.

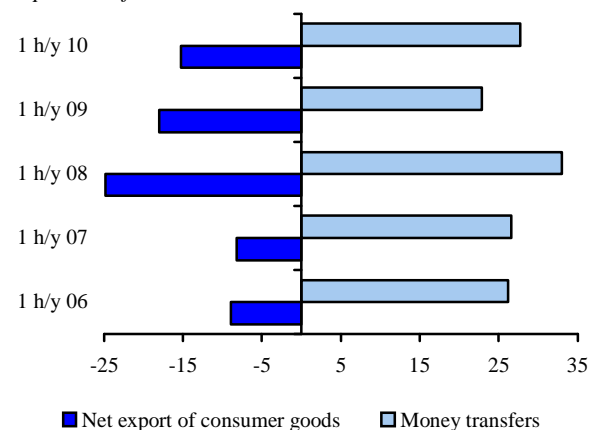
Net inflow of current transfers to **other sectors** (standard presentation of balance of payment) constituted US\$ 507.0 million, having increased by 21.9 percent. The main share in the total volume of receipts was accounted for the item "workers' remittances", net inflow of which increased by 24.6 percent in the reporting period.

In turn, in the gross inflow of workers' remittances, the largest share is accounted for money transfers through transfer systems<sup>3</sup> (98.7 percent). In the reporting period, net inflow through money transfer systems increased from US\$ 362.0 million to US\$ 453.0 million in the reporting. At the same time, in general geographic structure of money transfers remained unchanged. As per results of the first half of 2010, the main share of money transfers was from Russia (90.9 percent), USA (4.6 percent) and Kazakhstan (3.5 percent). Outflow of money transfers was mainly registered to Russia (97.8 percent).

*in percent of GDP*



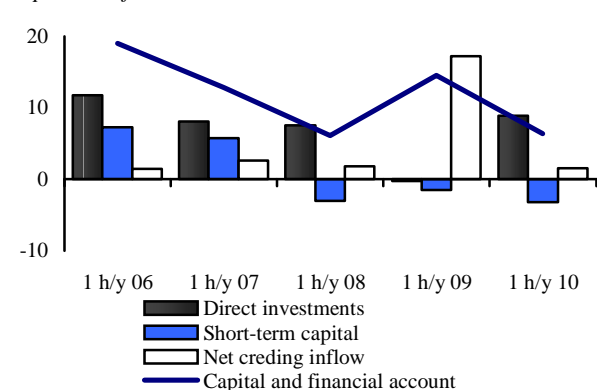
Balance of money transfers still covers net export of consumer goods, which was formed with the deficit in the amount of US\$ 275.8 million.

#### CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The balance of **capital and financial account** was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 115.5 million in the first half of 2010, which was lower than the corresponding index of 2009 by 54.8 percent.

Deficit of **capital account** decreased by 11.9 percent from US\$ 17.2 million to US\$ 15.2 million in the reporting period. This change was caused mostly by transactions, related to movement of property of individuals, moving abroad for permanent residence. In the reporting period, the net-position on the item "migrants' transfers" decreased from US\$ 37.6 million to US\$ 35.8 million.

Positive balance of **financial account** decreased from

US\$ 272.9 million in the first half of 2009 to US\$ 130.7 million in corresponding period of 2010. This change occurred due to outflow of capital on other investments despite considerable inflow of foreign direct investments. As per results of the first half of 2010, there was inflow of direct investments in the Kyrgyz Republic in the amount of US\$ 132.9 million, whereas in the corresponding period of 2009 there was outflow in the amount of US\$ 5.8 million.

In the reporting period there was increase of outward foreign direct investments from US\$ 1.2 million to US\$ 27.1 million.

Increase in inflow of foreign direct investments was mainly registered from non-CIS countries, mainly from Canada (in the amount of US\$ 101.0 million and the United Kingdom (in the amount of US\$ 32.6 million). Among CIS-countries there was outflow of capital, mainly to Kazakhstan in the amount of US\$ 28.3 million.

By types of economic activity, inflow of direct investments was mainly observed in the processing industry in the amount of US\$ 112.3 million, in immovable property - US\$ 53.4 million and financial activity - US\$ 10.4 million.

In the reporting period, the volume of transactions on purchase of foreign securities by residents (mainly by commercial banks) decreased by 35.1 percent and constituted US\$ 7.8 million.

As per result of the first half of 2010, the item "other investments" was formed with the deficit in the amount US\$ 21.5 million against surplus at the level of US\$ 289.5 million in the corresponding period of 2009. This item was formed under the influence of decrease of external assets by US\$ 167.3 million whereas in the corresponding period of 2009 there was their increase by US\$ 24.0 million.

Alongside with this, there was outflow of capital on liabilities to non-residents, where negative balance constituted US\$ 188.9 million against positive value in the amount of US\$ 313.5 million in the first half of 2009.

External liabilities of the country were formed under the influence of outflow of capital from the banking

system in the amount of US\$ 191.9 million (in the first half of 2009 there was inflow of US\$ 16.4 million) and considerable decrease in volume of received loans (from US\$ 303.2 million in the first half of 2009 to US\$ 28.2 million in the reporting period).

The main share of loans in the first half of 2010 was accounted for the general government sector (US\$ 27.0 million), the volume of loans of private sector constituted US\$ 1.2 million. Thus, in the reporting period monetary assets in the amount of US\$ 46.5 million were attracted to general government sector. The main share of the disbursement was purposed for road rehabilitation in the republic (about US\$ 36.1 million). Remaining part of disbursement was directed to the following branches: energy, industry, state administration, agriculture.

Also, it should be noted that in the reporting period financial liabilities of Kyrgyzstan on service of the public external debt were satisfied in full and in time.

Thus, in the first half of 2010, US\$ 19.6 million was repaid for servicing lines of credit.

The item "accounts payable" was considerably changed, negative balance of which increased from US\$ 6.1 million in the first half of 2009 to US\$ 25.1 million in the corresponding period of 2010.

The item "**Errors and Omissions**" was formed with positive balance in the amount of US\$ 4.8 million, testifying the fact of under-accounting of transactions, related to inflow of capital into the republic or under-accounting of export of goods and services.

As of the end of the reporting period, **gross international reserves** constituted US\$ 1 568.4 million, which was by 1.3 percent less in comparison with the first half of 2009. Ratio of coverage with gold and foreign exchange reserves for future import of goods and services constituted 4.3 months.

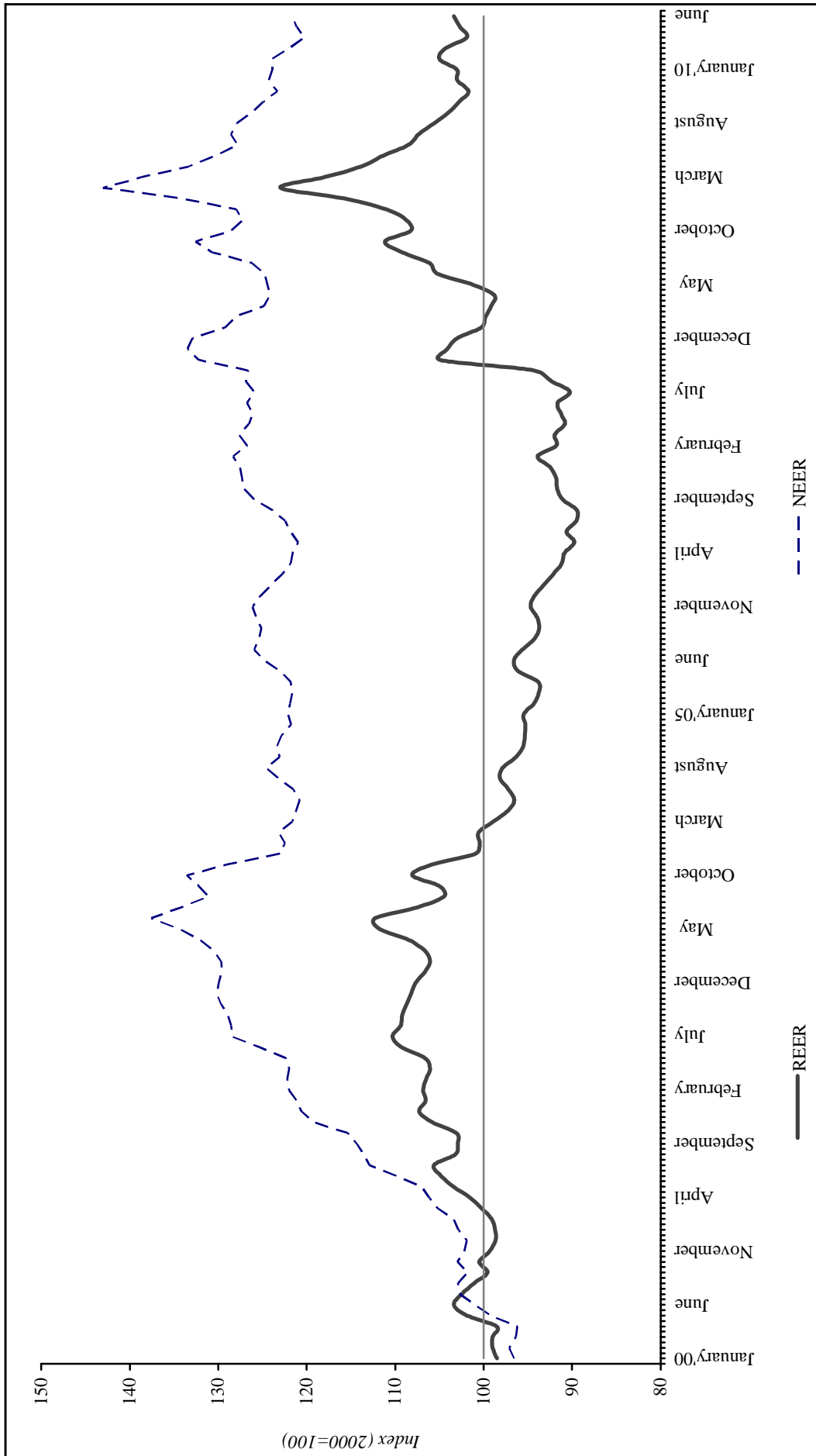
