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## ***Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic***

“Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic” is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The legislative basis for the balance of payments is the constitutional Law of the Kyrgyz Republic as of August 11, 2022 No. 92 “On the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic”. This document reflects the last tendencies in external sector development of the economy and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year in February, June, August and November and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

*This publication provides final data of the National Statistical Committee of the Kyrgyz Republic on foreign trade for 2022 in accordance with the annual data revision procedure.*

**Last day for update of data for the present publication is November 20 2023.**

- means, that indicators/ratios are equal to 0 (zero) or insignificant;
- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as “open period”.

It is published quarterly in Kyrgyz, Russian and English on the official website of the National Bank.

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The objective of the Report is to inform the public of the general assessment of financial system stability and sustainability in the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published twice a year in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

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These are the regulations, instructions and other regulatory acts adopted by the National Bank. Presumable publication frequency is once a month in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

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
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## CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

### Chart 1. Current account

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of the first half of 2023, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 3,448.2 million (50.4 percent of GDP) under the influence of an increase in the trade deficit and deterioration in the balance of services and secondary income.

### TRADE BALANCE<sup>1</sup>

*Considerable growth in imports amid slight rise in export volumes conditioned enlargement in the trade deficit.*

In the first half of 2023, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices totaled USD 3,724.3 million, having grown by 28.0 percent compared to the first half of 2022.

In the reporting period, **the foreign trade turnover** in FOB prices made USD 6,333.5 million, exceeding the comparable figure of the first half of 2022 by 30.6 percent.

**Export of goods in FOB prices** constituted USD 1,304.6 million. Export of goods excluding gold came out at USD 1,001.8 million, having increased by 3.3 percent compared to the first half of 2022.

At the end of the first half of 2023, **import of goods** in FOB prices demonstrated growth by 29.6 percent compared to the corresponding indicator for the same period of 2022 and figured up to USD 5,028.9 million.

## STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE<sup>2</sup>

**Export of goods in FOB prices**, excluding the National Bank's adjustments in accordance with the balance of payments methodology, was equal to USD 1,307.0 million. Exports excluding gold came up to USD 1,004.2 million, having grown by 3.5 percent compared to the first half of 2022.

In the first half of 2023, the products of industrial sector and agriculture were the basis of the commodity structure of export.

During the period considered, the volume of production output of base metals and manufactured metal articles fell by 8.3 percent because of a reduction in the production of non-ferrous metals by 8.9 percent<sup>3</sup>. Whereas, in January-June 2023, export of gold reached USD 302.8 million.

Moreover, during the period under review, there was growth in the volume of ore and precious metals concentrates (by USD 13.8 million). However, there was a reduction in the export of non-ferrous base metal waste and scrap (by USD 5.5 million). The fluctuations in the value of these items were conditioned by changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

According to the NSC KR, in January-June 2023, slight growth in gross output of agricultural products resulted from rise in crop production<sup>4</sup>. In addition, there was a reduction in the supplies of vegetables (by USD 26.0 million), live animals (by USD 12.3 million), and cotton (by USD 8.8 million) among the large commodity items. Moreover, there was advancement in the supplies of cereal preparations and preparations of flour or starch (by USD 2.7 million), as well as fish (by USD 1.5 million).

In January-June 2023, there was an increase in the volume of production output of textile, clothes and footwear, leather and other leather articles by 38.5 percent owing to expansion in clothes output by 1.6 times<sup>5</sup>. Despite this, export of the main products of garment production decreased by 55.6 percent and totaled USD 51.4 million. A decrease was largely conditioned by fall in export on the items such as “articles of apparel made of textile fabrics, knitted or non-knitted” (by USD 26.0 million), “clothing accessories, knitted or non-knitted, crocheted or not-crocheted” (by USD 14.4 million) and “garments, knitted or crocheted for women and girls” (by USD 9.5 million). Changes in other commodity items had slight impact on the export of garment goods.

The share of the non-EAEU countries prevailed **in the geographical structure of exports** (51.1 percent) compared to the first half of 2022. In the monitored period, the largest volume of goods exports was sent to Switzerland, Uzbekistan and Türkiye (in total, the share made 67.2 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods constituted 48.9 percent respectively. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of these goods were supplied to Russia (61.0 percent) and Kazakhstan (37.0 percent).

Following the results of the first half of 2023, **import of goods** in CIF prices went up by 30.4 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and reached USD 5,401.3 million.

In January-June 2023, the total value of import of goods of the SITC largest group – “machinery and transport equipment” – advanced by 2.6 times and came out at USD 2,517.6 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the serious increase was observed in supplies on the items “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of people” (by USD 740.4 million), “parts of equipment for production machinery” (by USD 307.7 million) and “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 64.7 million).

Besides, there was a decrease in imports only on one item “sewing-machine needles; furniture, parts for the machines and furniture” (by USD 39.2 million).

During the period covered by the report for 2023, import of goods of the group “manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” grew by 6.4 percent and figured up to USD 1,095.6 million. The items such as “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 182.3 million), “cast iron and steel” (by USD 28.8 million), and “rubber tyres” (by USD 3.1 million) demonstrated substantial advancement. Furthermore, there was a cut-down in import of “locksmith’s equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 93.3 million).

In the first half of 2023, import of commodity items of the section “mineral fuel, lubricants and oils” fell by 32.1 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and totaled USD 375.4 million. The petroleum products had a considerable share in the commodity structure of imports in this group. During the period considered, the value of imported petroleum products dropped by 41.7 percent and made USD 266.7 million. There was a reduction in the supplies of gasoline (by USD 93.7 million), gas oil (by USD 81.8 million) and kerosene (by USD 26.7 million). Besides, there was a relatively slight rise in supplies of lubricants by USD 6.8 million and other petroleum products – by USD 2.7 million.

During the period under review, import of goods of the group “miscellaneous manufactured articles” fell by 42.5 percent and constituted USD 427.9 million. Decrease in value was largely conditioned by the reduction in imports on the items “footwear” and “articles of apparel and clothing accessories”, the value of supplies thereof went down by USD 135.2 and 169.3 million, respectively. Other commodity items of the group showed insignificant changes in the value of supplies.

During the period considered, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries fell down to 25.2 percent (in the first half of 2022, 36.2 percent) **in the geographic structure of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, are also imported from these countries.

Summarizing the results of the first half of 2023, the share of the non-EAEU countries advanced significantly compared to the same period in 2022 (63.8 percent) and came up to 74.8 percent. The upward dynamics of imports from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of intermediate and consumer goods. China remains the largest trading partner with the share of 54.3 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In the first half of 2023, goods were also supplied from Türkiye (5.9 percent), the Republic of Korea (5.7 percent), the USA (4.9 percent) and Germany (4.6 percent).



## BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

*The negative balance of the international services increased, being conditioned by outstripping growth in import of services compared to export thereof.*

At the end of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative equal to the amount of USD 233.0 million, having increased by 2.4 times compared to the first half of 2022. The export of services grew by 87.2 percent and figured up to USD 898.3 million, while the import of services rose by 96.1 percent, up to USD 1,131.4 million.

During the monitored period, as before, the defining items of services were “travels” and “transport services”, which in total constituted 74.6 percent of the turnover of international services.

During the period considered, the balance of transport services was traditionally formed negative and reached USD 338.5 million, having increased by 55.2 percent compared to the same period in 2022. This trend was conditioned by more significant growth of import of transport services compared to their exports: imports went up by USD 175.5 million or 47.4 percent, basically owing to railway transport services, whereas exports upsized by USD 55.1 million or 36.2 percent, generally because of air and automobile transport services.

The balance of the item “travels” was formed positive being equal to USD 221.0 million, having advanced by 27.7 percent compared to the first half of 2022. In the period under review, the total volume of services related to the trips of the citizens of the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (export of services) rose by 96.6 percent and made USD 491.8 million. This growth was predominantly conditioned by crucial enhancement in the tourist flow particularly from the neighboring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) went up by 3.5 times and totaled USD 270.8 million.

The balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” was formed negative, having risen by 73.7 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and constituted USD 85.9 million. Growth on this item was observed in both directions – exports and imports, which was a result of the progressive global demand for the formation of tours and trips, including the development of the tourism and travel industry in the Kyrgyz Republic. Thus, exports came up by 3.7 times (up to USD 77.3 million) compared to the same period of 2022, and imports advanced by 2.3 times (up to USD 163.3 million).

## BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

*Dynamics of the item “primary income” in the period under review was chiefly defined by the change in the volume of non-residents’ incomes on direct investments.*

Based on the results of the first half of 2023, the balance of the item “**primary income**” was formed negative in the sum of USD 308.5 million, having fallen by 42.6 percent compared to the same indicator in the first half of 2022. This dynamics was largely conditioned by reduction down to USD 239.1 million in the volume of resident companies’ reinvested income received by the foreign investors. The volume of accrued dividends payable decreased by 27.9 percent and was equal to USD 27.7 million. As a result, the balance of investment income on direct investments was formed negative with USD 292.8 million, having declined by 37.9 percent compared to the level of income payable in the first half of 2022.

The volume of accrued interest payable on other investments of the public and private sectors totaled USD 53.7 million. Interest receivable on other investments corresponded to USD 39.1 million. As a result, the net volume of accrued interest payable on the item “other investments” went down by 75.9 percent compared to the first half of 2022 and made USD 14.6 million.

During the period covered by the report, the balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 1.2 million and fell by 78.1 percent as a result of a reduction in the total volume of income of the non-residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

## BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

*Cut-down in net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item “secondary income”.*

At the end of the first half of 2023, positive balance of **secondary income** constituted USD 817.6 million, having gone down by 29.8 percent through a decline by 29.4 percent in private transfer receipts, down to USD 818.8 million.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, almost the entire volume of receipts was provided by money transfers of individuals. During the monitored period, the gross inflow of money transfers declined by 28.2 percent, and outflow came down by 24.1 percent. As a result, the net inflow fell by 29.5 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and reached USD 811.2 million.



Money transfer systems<sup>6</sup> remain the main mode of remittances to the country, which provide more than 90 percent of all remittances to the country. At the end of the first half of 2023, the gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems were reduced by 28.7 percent compared to 2022 and constituted USD 961.4 million<sup>7</sup>. The volume of remittances outflow from the country also declined and totaled USD 256.8 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money

transfer systems fell by 28.5 percent and made USD 704.6 million. The share of postal and private transfers between the individuals through the bank accounts remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. As of the end of the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (90.6 percent). In the structure of remittances forwarded from the Kyrgyz Republic, the weighty share also falls on the Russian Federation (77.9 percent).

Regarding the results of the first half of 2023, net inflow of remittances assessed as USD 811.2 million was insufficient to cover net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the volume of USD 1,263.3 million.

#### CAPITAL ACCOUNT

*The balance of the capital account was formed positive to a large extent as a consequence of the capital transfers inflow.*

On the back of the results of the first half of 2023, the **capital account** was formed with a positive balance equal to USD 98.7 million thanks to net inflows of public sector's capital transfers for USD 83.7 million from abroad.



## FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the financial account was formed positive first of all owing to the dynamics of other investments.

At the end of the first half of 2023, net lending to the rest of the world, presented in the financial account (analytical representation of the balance of payments), totaled USD 29.6 million, however in the same period of 2022, there was net borrowing equal to USD 209.4 million. In the period considered, the financial account, as before, experienced major impact of the items “other investments” and “direct investments”.

In the first half of 2023, foreign economic transactions on the item “other investments” provided net lending to the rest of the world

for USD 275.8 million, but in the first half of 2022, there was net borrowing from the rest of the world assessed as USD 25.9 million. In the period under review, the dynamics of other investments was mostly determined by the net purchase of financial assets. The assets of residents outside the Kyrgyz Republic went up by USD 279.2 million (in the first half of 2022, assets increased by USD 223.4 million) was explained by a serious increase in the total volume of cash currency and deposits of the resident banks abroad by USD 286.3 million. In contrast, the trade credits and advances of private sector were reduced by USD 7.4 million. As of the end of the first half of 2023, the prevailing volume of enterprises’ accounts receivable fell on the wholesale and retail trade, processing industry, as well as institutions engaged in the professional, scientific and technical activity.

During the period under consideration, net incurrence of liabilities being equal to USD 3.4 million was principally a result of growth in the commercial banks’ liabilities in the form of cash currency and deposits in foreign accounts by USD 18.4 million. In addition, there was a reduction in liabilities on loans and borrowings of all sectors of the economy by USD 15.8 million (in the first half of 2022, liabilities on loans and borrowings rose by USD 53.1 million), basically because of the excess of payments on the principal amount of debt over the volume of credits received by the private sector. Other sectors’ debts on trade credits and advances grew by USD 0.9 million (in the same period of 2022, there was an advancement in liabilities on trade credits and advances by USD 121.9 million).

During the period considered, the negative balance on direct investments came up to USD 255.7 million (net borrowing), which was predominantly conditioned by growth in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents assessed as USD 260.9 million through receipt of reinvested earnings in the sum of USD 239.1 million.

In the sectoral structure, the main volume of direct foreign investment was forwarded to the enterprises of processing industries (net inflow – USD 29.9 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 26.7 million), professional, scientific and technical activity (USD 8.0 million), as well as mining (USD 6.3 million). However, there were net outflow from the sectors of arts, entertainment and recreation (USD 3.8 million) and the enterprises engaged in construction (USD 1.6 million).

The balance of the item “errors and omissions” was formed positive in the volume of USD 3,004.2 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of the first half of 2023 constituted USD 2,439.4 million, which covers 2.6 months of future imports of goods and services.


