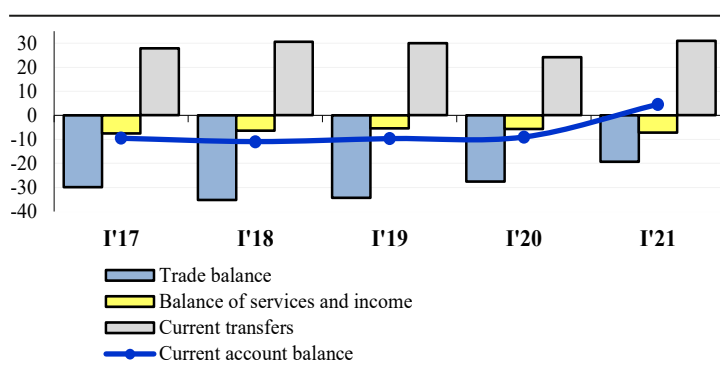

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CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent of GDP)

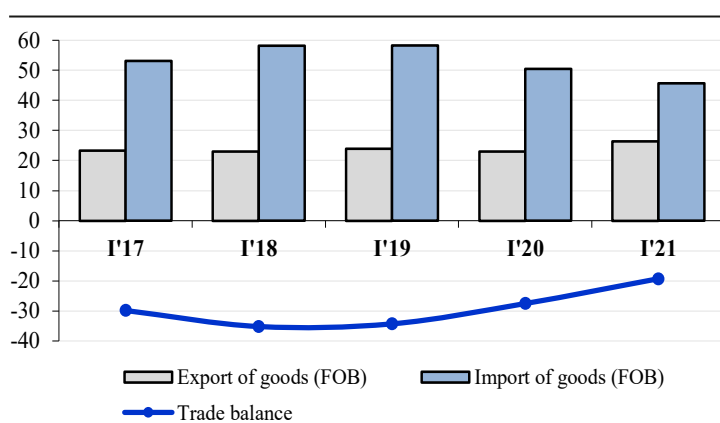


At the end of Q1 2021, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 83.5 million (4.6 percent of GDP). The indicator was formed under the influence of growth in incomes payable to non-residents and an increase of the deficit in the balance of goods and services. At the same time, this dynamics was partially offset by the growth of current transfers receipts.

TRADE BALANCE¹

According to the results of Q1 2021, the outstripping rates of decline in exports of goods compared to a decrease in imports conditioned an increase in the trade deficit.

In Q1 2021, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices amounted to USD 466.0 million, having increased by 5.8 percent compared to Q1 2020.

In the reporting period, **the external trade turnover** in FOB prices amounted to USD 1,347.7 million, having decreased by 4.3 percent compared to the same period of 2020.

Exports of goods in FOB prices decreased by 8.8 percent and amounted to USD 440.8 million. In the reporting period,

exports excluding gold amounted to USD 300.5 million, having increased by 11.1 percent. **The export excluding gold and the NBKR additional estimates** increased by 12.2 percent and amounted to USD 286.3 million.

The products of the industrial and agricultural sectors traditionally made the basis of the exports commodity structure according to the results of Q1 2021.

In the reporting period, there was a decrease in the production output of basic metals and finished metal products by 38.4 percent². In January-March 2021, gold exports decreased by 34.1 percent and amounted to USD 140.3 million. The aforementioned dynamics was the result of a decrease in the physical volume of gold supplies by 41.5 percent amid an increase in prices by 12.6 percent³. In addition, there was a decrease in exports of ores and precious metal concentrates (by USD 3.9 million).

At the same time, there was an increase in exports of non-ferrous base metal waste and scrap (by USD 11.2 million), ferrous waste and scrap (by USD 8.6 million), iron and steel (by USD 1.1 million). Fluctuations in the value of these items were due to changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

In January-March 2021, there was a decrease in the output of the textile sector, in the production of clothes and footwear, leather and other leather goods by 14.6 percent⁴. The export of the main products of garment production decreased by 66.7 percent and amounted to USD 9.9 million. The decrease was mainly due to a reduction in exports on the item “articles of apparel, of textile fabrics, whether or not knitted or crocheted” (by USD 18.5 million). In general, there was a decrease in the volume of supplies for all the main commodity items of this group, except for women’s and girls’ garments made of textile fabrics (an increase by USD 1.6 million).

According to the NSC KR, in January-March 2021, an increase in the gross agricultural output was due to growth in the production of livestock sector⁵. In the commodity structure of agricultural exports, there was an increase in the supplies of cereals, flour or starch (by USD 4.4 million), oils and other fats derived from milk (by USD 3.9 million), cotton (by USD 3.5 million) and fish (USD 2.2 million). At the same time, there was a decrease in the supplies of fruits and nuts (by USD 11.0 million), vegetables (by USD 5.4 million).

The share of the non-EAEU countries (62.2 percent) prevailed in the geographic structure of exports. In the reporting period, the largest volume of exports of goods was directed to the UK (52.7 percent of the total exports to the non-EAEU countries). In the reporting period, Uzbekistan, Turkey and China were other significant partners of the Kyrgyz Republic from the non-EAEU countries. The goods of the processing industry and agricultural products were mainly supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods amounted to 37.8 percent. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of agriculture and the consumer goods industry. Almost the entire volume of goods was supplied to Russia (57.4 percent) and Kazakhstan (41.1 percent).

In Q1 2021, **imports of goods** in FOB prices decreased by 1.9 percent and amounted to USD 906.9 million amid current restrictive measures due to the spread of the COVID-19 disease.

In January-March 2021, the volume of imports of goods of the largest SITC group – “manufactured goods classified by material” – decreased by 18.6 percent and totaled USD 206.9 million, mainly due to a reduction in supplies of iron and steel (by USD 62.6 million). Among large commodity items, there was a decrease in locksmiths’ ware, safes and hardware (by USD 3.0 million), woven fabrics of man-made textile materials (by USD 2.7 million). At the same time, there was an increase in imports of knitted or crocheted fabrics (by USD 12.6 million).

In the reporting period, the total value of imports of the group “machinery and transport equipment” increased by 14.6 percent and amounted to USD 203.8 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the most significant growth in supplies was observed on the items “motor vehicles for the transport of goods and special purpose motor vehicles” (by USD 13.6 million) and “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 3.4 million). At the same time, there was a decrease in imports of such items as “parts and accessories of the motor vehicles” (by USD 5.0 million), “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of persons” (by USD 3.1 million) and “parts of the machinery and related equipment used in civil engineering and construction” (by USD 2.0 million).

According to the results of Q1 2021, imports of the commodity items in the group “mineral fuel, lubricants and related materials” decreased by 2.4 percent compared to Q1 2020 and amounted to USD 180.5 million. Petroleum products had the significant share in the commodity structure of the imports in this group. In the reporting period, the value of imports of petroleum products decreased by 13.6 percent and amounted to USD 139.9 million. There was a decrease in the supplies of diesel fuel (by USD 6.2 million), kerosene (by USD 5.3 million), gasoline (by USD 4.9 million), fuel oil (by USD 3.6 million) and others petroleum products (by USD 2.3 million).

In the reporting period, imports of goods of the group “food products and live animals” increased by 11.0 percent and amounted to USD 124.1 million. The increase in supplies was primarily conditioned by an increase in imports on the items “live animals” (by USD 4.4 million), “fruits and nuts” (by USD 4.4 million) and “meat and meat products” (by 2.0 USD million). At the same time, the volume of imports of wheat and surzhik flour decreased by USD 4.7 million and products from cereals, flour or starch by USD 1.8 million. There was a slight change in the value of supplies for other commodity items of the group.

In the reporting period, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries decreased down to 52.4 percent (56.9 percent in Q1 2020) **in the geographic distribution of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. In the reporting period, there was a decrease in supplies of consumer and investment goods besides energy carriers.

According to the results of Q1 2021, the share of non-EAEU countries amounted to 47.6 percent, exceeding the level of the same period in 2020 (43.1 percent). The growth dynamics of imports from third countries was mainly determined by an increase in supplies of investment goods and certain items of consumer goods. China remained the largest trading partner in imports of goods (34.6 percent of the total imports from the non-EAEU countries). In January-March 2021, the goods were supplied from Turkey (13.4 percent), Uzbekistan (13.1 percent) and the United States (8.3 percent).

BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

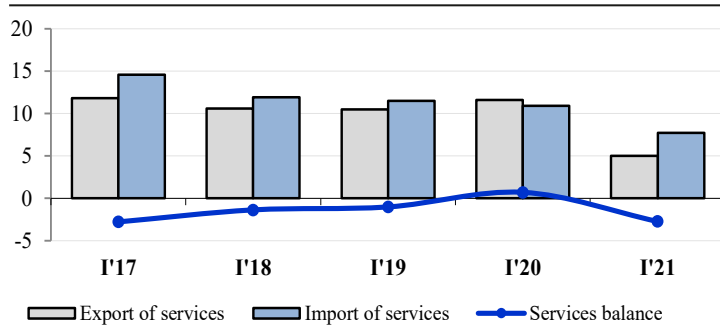
Restrictive measures aimed at restraining the spread of COVID-19 disease conditioned further decline in transport services and travels.

The balance of transport services in the reporting period was formed negative and amounted to USD 50.5 million, having increased by 41.4 percent compared to the same period of 2020. This trend was due to the outstripping growth in imports of transport services compared to their exports: mainly due to railway transport services, imports increased by 27.5 percent, meanwhile exports increased by 14.5 percent, mainly due to air transport services.

The restrictions imposed due to the COVID-19 disease have conditioned further reduction in the flow of tourists. In the reporting period, the total volume of services related to travel of citizens of foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (export of services) decreased by 58.5 percent. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) decreased by 72.4 percent. As a result, the positive balance of the item “travels” was formed in the amount of USD 23.9 million, having decreased by 34.0 percent compared to Q1 2020.

Net export of business services in the reporting period was formed negative and amounted to USD 2.4 million, having decreased by 60.6 percent. The positive trend on this item was due to a more significant reduction in imports of business services compared to a decrease in exports (26.2 and 1.9 percent, respectively).

According to the results of 2021, the turnover of international services decreased by 25.3 percent compared to the same period of 2020 and amounted to USD 251.3 million.

According to the results of the reporting period, **the balance of international services** was formed negative in the amount of USD 34.8 million, having increased by 4.8 times compared to Q1 2021 due to a faster decline in the export of services compared to their import (by 34.3 and 16.8 percent, respectively).

In the reporting period, **export of services** constituted USD 108.3 million, which corresponded to 24.6 percent of the total export of goods. **Imports of services** amounted to USD 143.0 million, which constituted 15.8 percent of import of goods.

In Q1 2021, the main services were travels, transport and business services became the defining items of services, which in total constituted 86.1 percent of the turnover of international services.

INCOME

The dynamics of the item “income” in the reporting period was defined by the change in the volume of non-residents’ income on direct investments.

According to the results of Q1 2021, the balance of the item “income” was found negative in the amount of USD 61.4 million against a positive indicator in the amount of USD 14.0 million in the same period of 2020. This trend was mainly due to an increase in the direct foreign investors’ income resulted from growth in the amount of distributed profit in the form of dividends up to USD 388.0 million. At the same time, the volume of the enterprises’ reinvested profit increased up to USD 356.1 million. As a result, the balance of the item “income of the non-residents on direct investments” was formed negative in the amount of USD 34.0 million (a surplus of USD 34.2 million in Q1 2020).

The volume of interest payments on previously received loans increased by 22.6 percent and amounted to USD 26.4 million. Payments under the item “other incomes on other investments” decreased by 76.9 percent and amounted to USD 0.9 million. As a result, non-residents received income in the amount of USD 25.5 million on the item “other investments”, which is 44.4 percent higher than the level of Q1 2020.

The balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 1.8 million, having decreased by 28.3 percent due to a decrease in the total volume of incomes of the non-residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

TRANSFERS

In Q1 2021, the positive trend in the receipt of private transfers had a decisive impact on the balance of current transfers.

In Q1 2021, positive balance of **current transfers** amounted to USD 478.7 million, having increased by 17.1 percent due to an increase in the private transfer receipts by 19.1 percent (USD 479.5 million).

In the structure of private transfers, as before, the money transfers of labor migrants provided almost the entire volume of receipts. In the reporting period, the gross inflow and outflow of money transfers increased by 17.4 and 8.9 percent, respectively. As a result, the net inflow of money transfers increased by 19.8 percent compared to the same indicator of Q1 in the last year and amounted to USD 474.9 million.

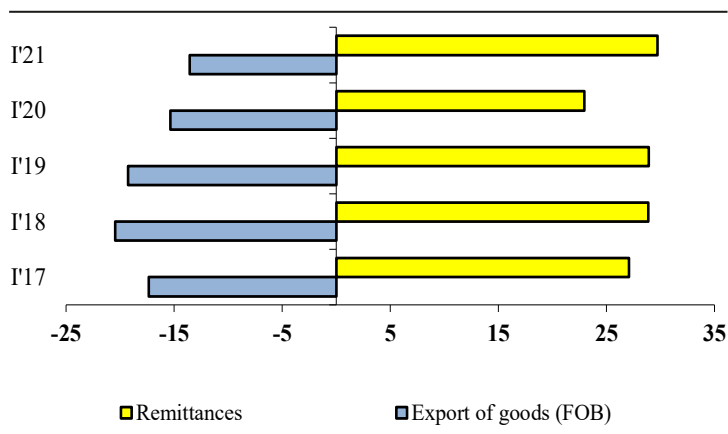

Money transfer systems⁶ remain the main mode of the labor migrants' remittances to the country. In January-March 2021, the net volume of funds received through the money transfer systems constituted USD 542.9 million⁷, having increased by 18.6 percent compared to Q1 2020. The volume of remittances transferred from the country increased by 7.3 percent and constituted USD 122.9 million.

The geographic structure of money transfers remains unchanged. According to the results of the reporting period, the prevailing share of money transfers was received from the Russian Federation (97.4 percent). In the structure of transfers sent from the Kyrgyz Republic, the prevailing share also falls on the Russian Federation (96.3 percent).

Remittances remain the main source of trade deficit financing. The balance of remittances still covers net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value of USD 254.4 million.

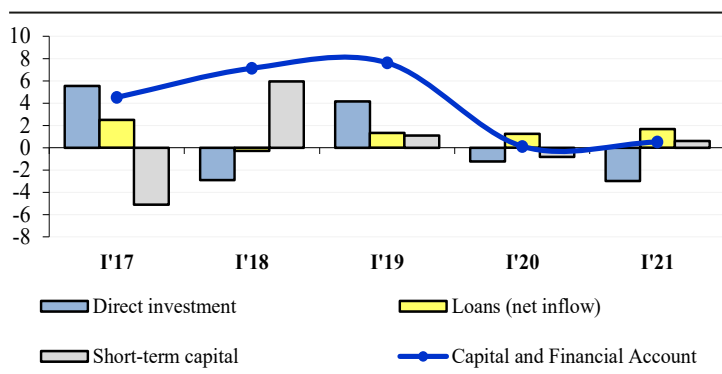

CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

Capital and financial account surplus was conditioned by the inflow of capital transfers to the public sector.

According to the results of Q1 2021, **the capital and financial account** (analytic presentation of the balance of payments) was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 24.0 million against the negative value in the amount of USD 407.6 million at the end of Q1 2020.

The balance of **the capital account** was formed positive in the amount of USD 22.8 million, having increased by 2.2 times more compared to the same period of the last year.

According to the results of Q1 2021, **the financial account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 1.2 million compared to a negative balance in the amount of USD 418.0 million in Q1 2020. The financial account experienced major impact of the items “direct investments” and “other investments”. In the reporting period, the balance of the item “direct investments” was formed positive and amounted to USD 14.1 million, meanwhile in January-March 2020, the balance on this item was negative in the amount of USD 345.2 million⁸. The volume of financial assets invested in other capital formed positive in the amount of USD 382.3 million. Net outflow of financial assets on the share capital and reinvested profit amounted to USD 11.2 million and USD 356.1 million, respectively.

According to the results of the reporting period, the balance on the item “other investments” was formed negative in the amount of USD 12.8 million, having significantly decreased compared to the same indicator in Q1 2020 (USD 87.8 million with a negative sign). The indicator of this item was formed due to the increase in the residents’ assets abroad and the growth in their liabilities to the non-residents.

In January-March 2021, the foreign assets of the residents increased by USD 69.8 million, having decreased by 23.8 percent compared to the same period in 2020. The growth of the resident enterprises’ accounts receivable by USD 77.6 million had the significant impact on the increase in the volume of foreign assets. As of the end of Q1 2021, the prevailing volume of accounts receivable fell on the enterprises that are engaged in the wholesale and retail trade, the processing industry, as well as the institutions of professional, scientific, technical activity, and construction. The commercial banks’ foreign assets in the form of cash and deposits on the foreign accounts, as well as the assets on the residents’ accounts outside the country increased by USD 12.2 and 9.2 million, respectively. At the same time, there was a decrease in claims on the non-residents on other assets by USD 29.3 million.

According to the results of Q1 2021, the liabilities to the non-residents increased by USD 57.0 million. An increase in the volume of the resident enterprises’ accounts payable by USD 69.5 million mainly influenced this trend. In general, the prevailing share in the total volume of accounts payable fell on the enterprises that are engaged in the wholesale and retail trade, in the processing industry, mining, information and communication, which together account for more than 80.0 percent of the total amount of debt.

The net outflow of loans to the public and private sectors in the analytic presentation of the balance of payments increased by 87.0 percent compared to Q1 2020 (net outflow in the amount of USD 9.3 million) and amounted to USD 17.4 million. The net outflow of funds in the amount of USD 12.5 million was observed on loans to the public sector due to the excess of payments on the principal amount of debt (USD 44.9 million) over the volume of loans received by the public sector (USD 32.4 million).

According to the results of Q1 2021, the volume of loans received by the private sector decreased by 51.1 percent compared to the same period of 2020 and amounted to USD 59.2 million. The volume of payments on the principal amount of the private sector debt decreased by 55.2 percent (down to USD 64.0 million). As a result, the net volume of loans to the private sector was formed negative in the amount of USD 4.9 million.

In the reporting period, the liabilities of the commercial banks in the form of cash and deposits increased by USD 5.0 million, having decreased by 37.2 percent compared to the level of Q1 2020 (USD 7.9 million).

At the end of the first quarter of 2021, the overall net balance of payments was formed negative in the amount of USD 170.6 million.

The balance of the item “errors and omissions”, taking into account the additional assessments of the National Bank, was formed negative in the amount of USD 111.0 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of Q1 2021 amounted to USD 2,523.1 million, which covers 6.6 months⁹ of the future import of goods and services.

Transfer to methodology according to the 6th Edition of the Balance of Payments and International Investment Position Manual

Currently, the balance of payments statistic is compiled by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in accordance with the requirements of the International Monetary Fund's Balance of Payments Manual, the fifth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM5). However, in order to provide compliance of the external sector statistics methodology with the new international standards, the National Bank takes measures on compiling the balance of payments statistics based on the IMF's new methodology – the Balance of Payments Manual, the sixth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM6).

This box provides the users with balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic (analytical form), as well as international investment position of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled based on the BPM6 methodology.

Given that the BPM6 has high degree of continuity with the methodology of the BPM5, the balance of payments accounts changed as some items of the balance of payments were regrouped in accordance with the BPM6.

The main changes in the accounting system for transactions in the BPM6 as compared to the BPM5 are given in Table 1.

List of Amendments in Accounts of the Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic according to the BPM6 Methodology

Goods

According to the BPM6 methodological requirements, the item “Goods” underwent significant changes, which affected the form of this account’s presentation, regrouping of items and differentiation of individual goods due to their special role in the financial markets. Thus, the following components are recommended to be reflected in the item “Goods”: *export/import of goods according the balance of payments methodology, net exports of goods under merchanting, non-monetary gold.*

In adapting the balance of goods of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic with the requirements of the BPM6, the following amendments were made:

- export/import of goods and non-monetary gold are introduced as the main components;
- re-export is defined separately as an additional item in the export of goods;
- goods procured in ports by carriers are included in the item of export/import of goods, meanwhile, according to the BPM5 such goods were defined as a separate item under goods;
- migrant’s personal effects are not included in the item of export/import of goods and are not reflected in any other balance of payments accounts, as according to a new interpretation, this concept is not classified as an operation;
- goods acquired to be processed, goods sent abroad for repair are excluded from the item “Goods”, because there is no transfer of ownership for the goods between a resident and a non-resident in accordance with the BPM6 methodology

Services

Significant amendments were not introduced in the general concept of accounting the international services in the balance of payments. The main adjustments according to the new BPM6 include clarification in the procedure and methodology of accounting for several indicators, as well as rearrangement or renaming of the sections and particular items on services account to bring the services account in line with the conceptual framework of the System of National Accounts (SNA 2008) and the Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services (UN, 2011).

The following adjustments on the service account of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic were made in order to bring it in line with the BPM6 methodology:

- a new item “Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others”, which includes only the fee charged by an entity that does not own the goods and engaged in the processing of material resources, was introduced in the section of services;
- postal and courier services (previously recorded in the item “Communication services”) are included in the item “Transport services”;
- the item “Construction services” was renamed in “Construction”, which mainly reflects the fact that the construction works, as well as the goods and services purchased by a non-resident enterprise that is building in the country where construction activities are carried out, are

accounted in this item. The construction is divided into “construction abroad” and “construction in the Kyrgyz Republic”;

- the item “Royalties and license payments” (previously reflected in the item “Business services”), according to the BPM6 methodology was renamed and represents a separate item entitled “Charges for the use of intellectual property, not classified in other categories”;
- a new item, that combines telecommunication services (previously recorded in the item “Communication services”) with computer and information services, which previously represented a separate item, was introduced.

Primary income

To ensure consistency between the accounts of foreign economic activity and the national accounts, the item “Income” and its components are brought into line with the item “Primary income account” of the SNA 2008. A detailed breakdown of the investment income is introduced; this breakdown allows linking it with the functional and instrumental classifications of the financial instruments. At the same time, generally, the indicators of the item remain comparable with the data compiled using the BPM5 methodology.

Secondary income

In general, the conceptual framework for accounting current transfers in the balance of payments did not change significantly and maintained continuity with the BPM5 methodology. According to the BPM6 methodological requirements, the item “Current transfers” was renamed into “Secondary income”. More detailed classification of the types of current transfers is provided; certain definitions and procedures of accounting for particular sub- items of the secondary income account are clarified and distinguished.

Financial account

Generally, the basic principles for compiling a financial account according to the BPM6 did not change. The new methodology clarifies the concepts of direct investment, which were brought in line with the fourth edition of the “OECD Benchmark Definition of Foreign Direct Investment”. In particular, the definitions of control and influence, the recording methods of the investment chains and fellow enterprises, as well as presentation of assets and liabilities on the gross basis in accordance with the principle of direction were revised. Functional and instrumental categories of the financial account were expanded and supplemented.

In the course of bringing in compliance with the BPM6 requirements, the following amendments were introduced into the financial account of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic (except for the amendments related to the column names and the interpretation of signs related to the financial account reflected in Table 1):

- name of the item “Reinvested instruments” in direct investments, according to the BPM6 methodology, was renamed to “Reinvestment of earnings”, in order to separate it from the corresponding item on the primary income account;
- credits provided directly to the suppliers of goods and services, as well as advances and prepayments to the customer for goods and services accounted in the item “Accounts receivable and payable” according to the BPM5, are included in the item “Trade credit and advances”. Moreover, other debts that are not classified as trade credits and advances or other instruments of the financial account are included in the item “other accounts payable/receivable”;
- other equity instruments not classified as direct investments are included in “other investments” as a separate item;
- liabilities in arrears is still reflected in the original instrument until liquidation of obligation, meanwhile, according to the BPM5, the old liability was assumed to have been repaid and a new one was created instead and that such contingent transaction was reflected in the item “Other assets/other liabilities”.

In addition to the amendments mentioned above, the National Bank will continue to work on further clarifying and improving the statistical recording of the balance of payments accounts in accordance with the BPM6 methodological requirements.

Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices

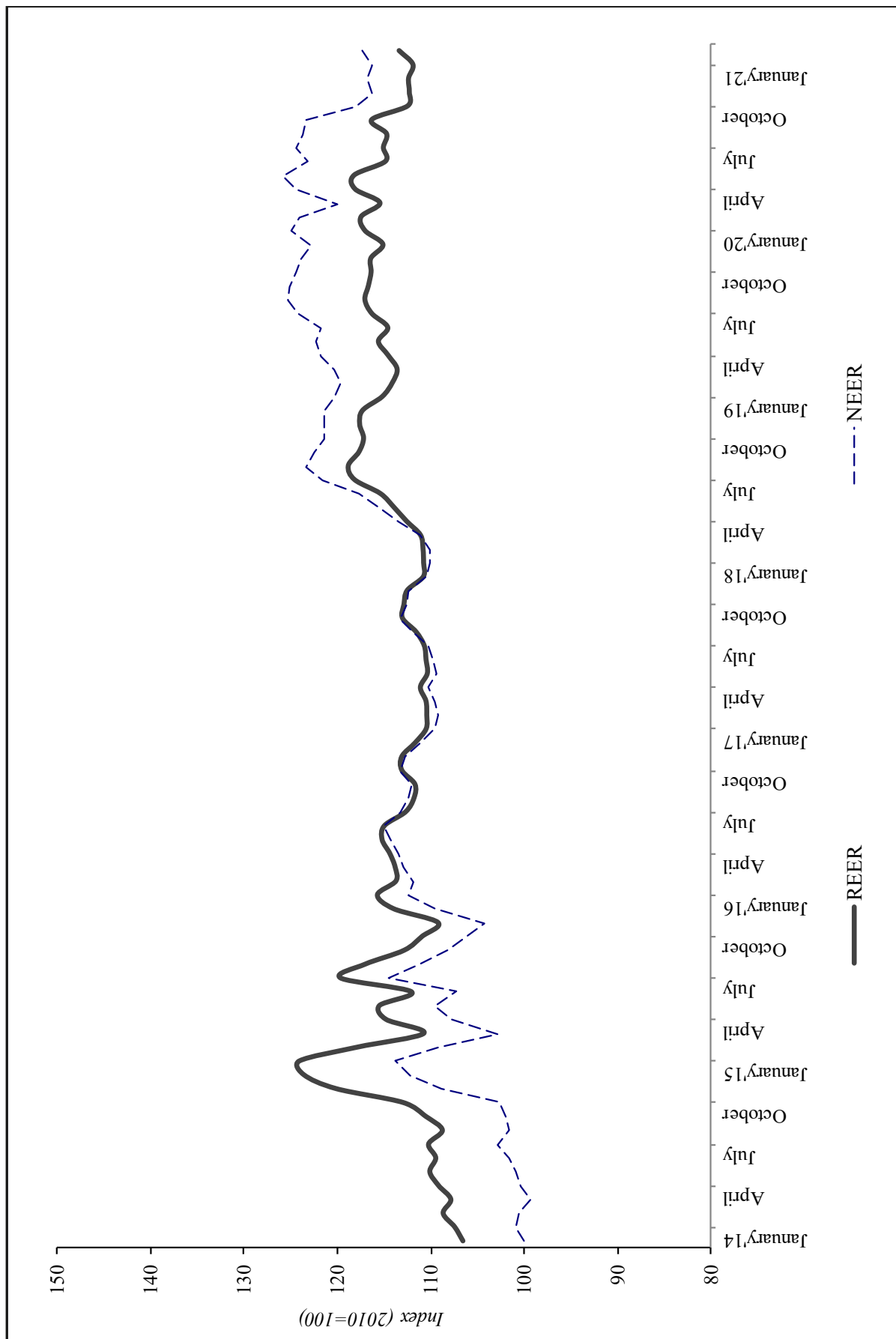
