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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

The Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic is prepared by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The periodical describes recent developments in the external sector and contains statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and an international investment position, as well as a technique and a database to compile the balance of payments. It is published four times a year - in January, May, July, and October. It is published in three languages: Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

It is published quarterly in Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

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The goal of the publication “Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic” is to officially publish the statutory acts of the National Bank to furnish the commercial banks and the public with the normative documents of the National Bank and to promulgate the banking legislation of the Kyrgyz Republic. The assumptive periodicity of the journal is to publish it once a month in Kyrgyz and Russian.

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
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CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

Economy development in the Kyrgyz Republic was quite dynamic in Q1 2007. The surplus balance amounted to USD 1.7 Million against the credit balance of USD 5.8 Million for the same period of 2006. In the reporting period, the current account deficit was USD 165.9 Million, which was 3.9 times higher than that in the relevant period of 2006. The current account deficit in reference to GDP made 17.2 per cent.

TRADE BALANCE

In Q1 2007, the foreign trade turnover of the Kyrgyz Republic increased by 54.6 per cent as compared to the same period of 2006, and in value terms made USD 755.1 Million. It must be mentioned that the growth rate of import transactions was much ahead of that of the export transactions.

Trade balance in Q1 2007 was formed with the credit balance deficit of USD 248.5 Million, having exceeded the index of Q1 2006 by 87.8 per cent.

Export of goods FOB in Q1 2007 made USD 253.3 Million, and increased by 42.2 per cent as compared to the results of the first three months of 2006.

A significant growth of export, more than 4 times over, is observed for the energy products due the re-export of aircraft fuel and motor petrol to the partner countries. Consumer products export increased by 36.9 per cent. Some product categories, such as fruit and vegetables, clothes, incandescent lamps had effected the growth of import. The primary products

export increased by 5.8 per cent. The structure of primary products export demonstrated an increase of mineral and scrap metal shipments. The export of nonmetallic minerals, equipment, spare parts and vehicles components grew in the category of investment goods. As a whole, the export of investment goods increased by 10.4 per cent. At the same time the decrease of intermediate products export by 12.5 per cent was observed, mainly due to the decrease of gold shipments to Switzerland.

In the geography of export for Q1 2007, the shares of neighboring countries and far abroad countries were 38.2 and 61.8 per cent correspondingly.

The export to far abroad countries increased in the reporting period by 51.7 per cent and amounted to USD 154.4 Million. Kyrgyzstan mainly exported goods to Afghanistan and Switzerland, the shares of these countries in the total export volume made 26.4 and 20.6 per cent correspondingly.

Export shipments to the neighboring countries for the reporting period reached USD 95.2 Million and increased by 31.5 per cent as compared to the results of the same period of 2006. External supplies to the markets of the neighboring countries were mostly directed to Russia and Kazakhstan; their combined specific volume in the total export volume made 30.4 per cent.

Goods import FOB in Q1 2007 made USD 501.8 Million, which exceeded the same index of 2006 by 61.6 per cent.

The growth of import shipments FOB from neighboring countries made 72.5 per cent, and 47.5 per cent for that from far abroad countries.

The functional structure of import showed growth of all items. Energy products, consumer products and investment goods mostly effected the growth of import in the reporting period. The growth of energy products import was caused by the increase of import of oil products from Russia and Kazakhstan. The increased inflow of products such as grain, sugar, drinks, and medical supplies increased the total volume of imported consumer products. The investment goods import grew on the part of machines, construction equipment, communications equipment, trucks, scientific and control instruments.

In geography of import CIF in Q1 2007 the shares of neighboring and far abroad countries were 66.5 and 33.5 per cent correspondingly.

For the neighboring countries, the goods were mainly imported from Russia, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and Ukraine, which accounted for 65.0 per cent of the whole import to Kyrgyzstan.

China and USA were the main partners for import transactions among the far abroad countries.

REAL EFFECTIVE EXCHANGE RATE

Index of nominal effective exchange rate (NEER) as of the end of March 2007 was 127.8 which was a 4.8 per cent increase compared to the respective index of 2006. On the average, during Q1 2007 NEER index increased by 3.7 per cent as compared to the respective period of 2006.

REER index as of the end of March 2007 was 93.1, exceeding the respective index of 2006 by 1 per cent. On the average, during Q1 2007 REER index increased by 0.4 per cent as compared to the respective period of 2006. The value of REER index for the neighboring countries in Q1 2007 dropped by 2.0 per cent as compared to the Q1 2006, and for the far abroad countries it increased by 8.8 per cent.

Inflation in the trade partner countries had a certain influence on REER index increase.


Inflation rate for the major trade partners in Q1 2007

was 2.7 per cent in Russia, 0.9 per cent in the USA, 1.9 per cent – in Kazakhstan.

The volume of foreign trade turnover¹ of the Kyrgyz Republic, based on the results of Q1 2007, reached USD 579.0 Million, which was a 48.0 per cent increase as compared to the respective period of 2006. At the same time, the export growth exceeded the import growth twofold. The export volume² for the Kyrgyz Republic in Q1 2007 increased by 75.6 per cent and amounted to USD 193.9 Million compared to USD 110.4 Million in Q1 2006. Significant export growth was mostly caused by the increase in re-export volumes.

In the export structure there was a 32.7 per cent growth of export volume for fruit and vegetables, a 50.1 per cent increase in the export of construction materials, and a 87.5 per cent rise in the export of paper, paperboard, and paper products.

The growth of import shipments is observed along with the increase of export volumes. The import volume³ of the Kyrgyz Republic in Q1 2007 increased by 37.2 per cent and amounted to USD 385.1 Million compared to USD 280.7 Million in Q1 2006. The growth of import was mostly caused by shipping consumer products not produced in the Kyrgyz Republic. The physical volume of the grain import increased by 62.5 per cent, plastic materials import – by 22.5 per cent, rubber tires import – by 68.4 per



cent, fertilizers import – by 3.4 times, cast iron and steel import – by 58.6 per cent.

BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The deficit of the international services balance in Q1 2007 increased 5.2 times compared to the similar period of 2006 and amounted to USD 45.0 Million. The export of services increased 1.4 times, and the import of services increased by 90 per cent.

The total volume of services provided to non-residents, based on the results of first three months of 2007, was USD 88.0 Million. Its structure did not change significantly. Like in the previous year, the majority of export was shared between transportation services, travels, business services, and state services.

Export of transportation services increased by 40.7 per cent as compared to the same period of 2006. The volume of travel services provided for non-residents increased 1.8 times compared to the same period of 2006. This can be explained by improvements in the border registration procedures, as well as by the tourism development.

The volume of service import for the reporting period was USD 133.0 Million. The most important components of services import, as usual, were transportation services, which in the reporting period exceeded the index of Q1 2006 2.1 times and reached

USD 66.0 Million. The maximum share of 62.1 per cent of the total transportation services volume belonged to the rail transport. Another significant part of the service import in Q1 2007 were the business services, which increased 1.6 times compared to the

same period of 2006 and reached USD 27.4 Million for the reporting period.

PROFITS

In Q1 2007, the deficit of profit balance was USD 31.4 Million, which exceeded the comparable indicator of 2006 1.8 times.


The increase of credit balance deficit for this item was due to the increase of residents' expenses for the profits from direct investments and profits from other investments. Thus, the credit balance deficit of profits from direct investments increased 1.6 times compared to Q1 2006, making USD 21.6 Million. The maximum contribution to this change was made by the growth of profit reinvested by direct foreign investors into domestic companies. The profits from other investments also had a credit balance deficit of USD 5.1 Million compared to the surplus of USD 0.7 Million in the same period of 2006. The growth of credit balance deficit for this item was caused by an increase of the interest paid for foreign credits and the cost of commercial banks liabilities.

Same as in Q1 2006, the credit balance deficit of USD 4.8 Million formed in labor compensations. However, this indicator reduced by 5.9 per cent compared to the same period of 2006.

CURRENT TRANSFERS

The surplus of the current transfers balance for Q1 2007 increased by 37.1 per cent and amounted to USD 159.0 Million. Private transfers accounted for

Diagram 4: Balance of transfers and net export of consumer goods per cent of GDP




the largest share in the total volume of current transfers. Their net inflow increased by 36.9 per cent compared to the similar period of 2006, and amounted to USD 157.2 Million. The net inflow of official transfers did not change much compared to the base period, and made USD 1.8 Million.

Fees of Kyrgyzstan for its membership in international organizations in the reporting period made USD 0.5 Million.

CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

In the reporting period, the balance of **capital and financial transactions** formed a surplus of USD 51.6 Million, which was by 31.9 per cent lower than in 2006.

Capital transactions deficit in Q1 2007 was USD 29.3 Million, which was 6.5 times higher than in comparable period of 2006. It must be mentioned that this change, as in the previous years, occurred due to the increase of net outflows for the migrants' transfers, which was caused by the rise of migration and the outflow of migrants' assets.

In Q1 2007, the balance of **financial transactions** had a surplus of USD 80.8 Million. Increase of this balance was 0.6 per cent compared to Q1 2006.

The surplus of **direct investments** in the reporting period was USD 45.7 Million, which was 4.2 times

higher than in 2006. This was mostly caused by the increase in direct investments inflow to the Kyrgyz Republic. Thus, in the reporting period, the net inflow of the equity capital increased twofold, and the reinvested profit increased 1.6 times compared to Q1 2006. The net inflow of other capital made USD 6.2 Million compared to the net outflow of USD 11.7 Million.

Based on the transactions conducted by Kyrgyz commercial banks involving the foreign securities, the net inflow of **portfolio investments** during Q1 2007 made USD 0.2 Million, which was an 8 times decrease compared to Q1 2006. The surplus of **other investments** in the reporting period was USD 35.4 Million, which was 2.0 times lower than in the comparable period of 2006. This item in Q1 2007 was significantly influenced by the growth of external liabilities of the Kyrgyz Republic residents, while the foreign assets significantly decreased.

The net capital outflow for foreign residents' assets for the reporting period made USD 18.1 Million, which constituted a 3.5 times decrease compared to Q1 2006. This change was due to the decrease of assets outflow for all foreign assets. The outflow of foreign assets in commercial banks decreased in the reporting period by 21.4 per cent, and the net assets inflow made USD 9.4 Million, specifically in other assets, compared to the net outflow of USD 28.0 Million in the similar period of 2006.

The net inflow of foreign liabilities for Q1 2007 amounted to USD 17.3 Million, which exceeded the value of Q1 2006 2.1 times. The net inflow of foreign liabilities of commercial banks made USD 38.9 Million, and the net outflow of foreign liabilities was observed for other liabilities.

In Q1 2007, the **Errata** formed with a surplus of USD 108.3 Million compared to the credit balance of USD 38.8 Million for the similar period of 2006. The surplus of this item shows that transactions related to the capital inflow to the Kyrgyz Republic are not fully registered.


