Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

The Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic is prepared by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The periodical describes recent developments in the external sector and contains tables with data on analytic and standard formats of the balance of payments, a pattern of foreign trade, international reserves, external debt, a technique and a database to compile the balance of payments, and an international investment position of the Kyrgyz Republic. The NBKR reserves to itself the right to revise the balance of payments data for a period of 10 years due to a change in the technique or the change of the data by the National Statistics Committee, therefore, the period of 10 years is considered to be open. Periodicity of the issue: on a quarterly basis - in January, May, July, and October. It is published in three languages: Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

The latest data update for this publication: July 15, 2005.

This periodical contains the description of a dynamics of consumer prices in the republic and its regions, an analysis of basic inflation factors, information on decisions of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in the area of monetary policy and a forecast of inflation for the forthcoming period. It is published on the quarterly basis in Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

Banking System Development Trends

The goal of the publication "Banking System Development Trends" is to analyze and assess the banking system of Kyrgyzstan as a financial intermediary, identify obstacles to achievement and maintenance of stability, as well as to estimate the banking system stability components in Kyrgyzstan. It is published as of January 1 and July 1 in Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

The goal of the publication "Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic" is to officially publish statutory acts of the National Bank to furnish the commercial banks and the public with the normative documents of the National Bank and to promulgate the banking legislation of the Kyrgyz Republic. Assumptive periodicity of the journal is to publish it once a month (as the statutory acts are adopted) in Kyrgyz and Russian.

Press Release of the NBKR contains a chronicle of events in the National Bank and the basic data on the financial market. It is published on the weekly basis in Kyrgyz and Russian.



1. RECENT BALANCE OF PAYMENTS DEVELOPMENTS


According to the data for the first quarter of 2005, the balance of payments developed as negative of US\$ 11.5 million¹ (while in the 1st quarter of 2004 the balance was positive of US\$2.6 million). Thus, though the current account deficit changed insignificantly in the first quarter of 2005 (US\$20.3 million) as against the first quarter of 2004 (US\$21.4 million), an important tendency should be pointed out in its structure dynamics. Export in the first quarter of the current year showed the steady downward tendency in its rates of growth, caused, mainly, by a drop in production of gold. As a result, a trade gap

increased as compared to the first quarter of 2004 by 86.0 percent, while the balance of services - three times. At the same time, there was an increase in an inflow of current transfers from abroad, thereby offsetting a negative impact of growth of the trade gap on the size of the current account.

As a result of an increased volume of foreign trade, the general external commodity turnover of the republic increased in the first quarter of 2005 by 12.7 percent as compared to the similar period of the last year and totaled US\$ 393.2 million. Outstripping rates of growth of import over those of export determined the **import balance of trade** at the rate of US\$ 58.2

million as against the trade gap of US\$ 31.3 million for the corresponding period of 2004.

The volume of exports of goods as compared to the first quarter of 2004 increased by 5.4 percent and totaled US\$167.5 million.

The increase in the volume of exports in the first quarter of 2005 as compared to the first quarter of the last year resulted from both the increase in exports of gold (by 0.7 percent) and growth of volume of exports of other items (by 7.7 percent). The 5.9 percent increase in gold prices entailed growth of exports of gold, while in terms of volume exports of gold decreased by 4.9 percent.

The reason for growth of other items of export excluding gold was that of growth of export of mineral oil, inorganic chemical substances, glasses, and dairy products. The rise in prices (by 6.0 percent) was observed with respect to the basic items of export of goods, whose share was 89.0 percent of the total volume of exports in the accounting period, with physical deliveries keeping the unvaried volume. In value terms, the volume of exports of these goods thus increased by only 6.0 percent.

The share of Russia and Kazakhstan traditionally prevails in the geographical structure of export to the CIS countries. The volume of exports to these two countries, Russia and Kazakhstan, increased by 22.0 and 22.9 percent, correspondingly. The external deliveries to the markets of non-CIS countries were, substantially, those to the United Arab Emirates and Switzerland, whose share in the total volume of exports was 42.2 percent or US\$69.3 million.

Import of goods² at f.o.b. prices increased by 18.7 percent in the first quarter of 2005 as compared to the similar period of the last year and was equal to US\$ 225.7 million. At the same time, growth of import receipts in operations with the CIS countries was 20.6 percent, and with the non-CIS countries - by 15.5 percent.



Mineral oil, machines and equipment, cast-iron and steel, tools, as well as fertilizers, medicines, and sugar were the largest items, which influenced growth of the volume of imports in the first quarter of 2005.

Goods to the republic were also imported from, mainly, the CIS countries, with Russia having the largest share (26.8 percent of the total volume of imports) that increased by 6.2 percent as compared to the similar period of the last year. The deliveries of goods from Kazakhstan increased by 1.3 percent and were 16.2 percent of the total volume of imports. China, USA, Germany and Turkey were, as before, the basic suppliers of goods among the non-CIS countries.

The balance of international services in January to March 2005 developed as negative of US\$ 6.4 million against US\$ 1.7 million in the similar period of the last year. It was due to growth of imports of services by 42.1 percent, as well as due to the increased volume of services rendered to non-residents by 32.7 percent.

Proceeding from the results of the first three months 2005, the total volume of services provided to the non-residents was US\$56.5 million. Traditionally, the determining items of export of services were those of "Transportation Services", and "Trips". Alongside with these, the large share was noted in the current year with respect to such items, as construction and business services. The aggregate of these types of services was about 85.0 percent of the total volume of services rendered to the non-residents. Export of transportation services grew as compared to the base period from US\$ 9.2 to 12.0

million. The volume of services, provided to the non-residents under the item "Trips", decreased by US\$ 1.5 million as against the similar period of the last year. The volume of construction services increased from US\$ 1.2 million in the basic year to US\$ 7 million in the accounting period, with 63.1 percent being the share of export of construction services to Kazakhstan.

In the accounting period, the volume of import of services increased to US\$ 62.8 million as compared to US\$ 44.2 million in the base period. The transportation services were still the most significant component of import of services and made US\$ 27.0 million in the accounting period and US\$17.6 million - in the base period. The largest share, namely 56.9 percent, was that of railway transportation services.

One more significant component in imports of services in January to March 2005 was that of the business services, which appeared much above the similar parameter of the basic period: US\$ 8.1 million in the first quarter of 2004 and US\$ 13.8 million in the accounting one.

The deficit in the item "**Income**" was reduced in the first quarter of 2005 by 31.0 percent and totaled US\$ 19.3 million as compared to the corresponding period of the last year (US\$ 27.9 million in the 1st quarter of 2004). The decrease in a flow of reinvested income and interest payments on external credits and loans had the basic impact on the reduction of this item.

The volume of reinvested income was reduced from US\$ 15.8 up to 12.3 million and, speaking in general terms, as a result of this, the negative balance of income from direct investment totaled US\$12.9 million for the first three months of 2005 as compared to US\$ 17.2 million in the corresponding period of the last year. Having resulted from the reduction of interest payments on external loans of a private sector, the negative balance of income from other investment also decreased - from US\$ 7.8 million to US\$ 2.3 million.

The negative balance of the item "Remuneration of Labor" (from US\$ 2.9 million in the 1st quarter of 2004 to US\$ 4.2 million in the 1st quarter of 2005) somewhat increased, on the contrary, - due to also changes in the dynamics of these flows in the private sector of the economy.

The positive **balance of current transfers** increased by 61.4 percent in the first quarter of 2005.

The basic share in the total volume of current transfers was that of the private transfers, whose inflow doubled as compared to the similar period of the last year. The official transfers decreased from US\$ 8.1 million to US\$ 0.8 million due to, mainly, the reduction of the inflow of humanitarian aid.

Membership fees of Kyrgyzstan paid to international organizations remained at a level of the first quarter of 2004 and totaled US\$ 0.2 million.


In the first quarter of 2005 **the capital and financial account** developed as positive of US\$ 41.9 million, while in the first quarter of 2004 this parameter was negative and totaled US\$ 3.6 million. The essential inflow of capital - US\$ 45.1 million - was observed in the financial account. To a greater extent, it developed due to the reduction of external debt service payments by the private sector, as well as by transactions of commercial banks.

The net inflow of **direct foreign investments** in the first quarter of 2005 totaled US\$ 10.7 million, whereas in the corresponding period of the last year it made US\$ 15.8 million. The reduction of the net inflow of direct foreign investment was caused by, first of all, the decrease in reinvested profit, as well as by the change of dynamics of investments into share and other capital.

The net volume of attracted **portfolio investments** increased in the first quarter of 2005 by US\$ 12.6 million, while in the first quarter of the last year this parameter was reduced by US\$ 7.0 million. The balance of **other investment** for January to March 2005 developed as positive and totaled US\$ 47.0 million, as against the negative balance of US\$ 19.3 million for the first three months of the last year. The decrease in foreign assets, basically, is caused by the reduction in the assets of

commercial banks and debtor indebtedness (by US\$ 58.4 and 5.0 million US\$, correspondingly). In addition, the first one resulted, essentially, from the decrease in the foreign assets on accounts of banks abroad (correspondent nostro accounts).

The increase in external liabilities, as part of the item "Other investment", totaled US\$ 25.2 million in the accounting period, whereas last year this item showed the reduction by US\$ 25.2 million. The essential increase in the liabilities in the accounting period is partly connected to improved data collection and processing with respect to the transactions of commercial banks, better coverage and quality of statistics for the item "Other Investment".

Item "**Errors and Omissions**" in the 1st quarter of 2005 developed as negative of US\$ 33.1 million that testifies to under-accounting of the current account-related transactions.

Total international reserves of the NBKR were US\$ 562.7 million at the end of the accounting period and it corresponds to 5.9 months of import of goods and services.

(total, with CIS and non CIS countries)**


