
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CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent of GDP)




According to the results of nine months of 2019, the negative current account balance decreased down to USD 725.9 million (9.4 percent of GDP¹) due to an improvement in the balance of goods and services.

TRADE BALANCE²

According to the results of nine months of 2019, a decrease in imports, amid an increase in gold exports, conditioned a reduction of the trade balance deficit.

In January-September 2019, trade balance of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices was formed negative in the amount of USD 2,020.2 million (31.3 percent to GDP), having decreased by 16.5 percent as compared to the similar period of 2019.

The external trade turnover in FOB prices decreased by 2.6 percent compared to nine months of 2018.

Exports of goods in FOB prices constituted USD 1,403.6 million, having increased by 10.6 percent as compared to the same indicator of nine months of 2018.

In the reporting period, **the export excluding gold** constituted USD 840.3 million, having decreasing by 5.2 percent. **The export excluding gold and the NBKR additional estimates** decreased by 4.1 percent and constituted USD 797.9 million.

The products of the industrial and agricultural sectors traditionally prevailed in the goods structure of exports during nine months of 2019. In the reporting period, an increase in the value of exports was observed on these categories of goods primarily due to growth in output of the processing industries and agriculture.

In January-September 2019, the increase in the production output of the processing industries compared to the same period of 2018 was mainly due to the growth in the production of basic metals³. During nine months of 2019, gold exports increased by 47.2 percent and amounted to USD 563.3 million. Such dynamics resulted from an increase in the physical volume of gold supplies by 40.9 percent amid growth in the value of supplies by 4.5 percent⁴. There was also an increase in exports of ores and concentrates of precious metals by USD 11.8 million among other commodity items of metallurgical industry mainly due to an increase in the physical volume of supplies. There was a decrease in the total value of supplies for other commodity items of the group due to changes in the physical volume of supplies and the average supply prices.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, there was an increase in the output of the textile sector, in the production of clothes and footwear, leather and other leather goods by 6.1 percent⁵. However, in the reporting period of 2019, exports of the garment industry products decreased by 41.9 percent compared to nine months of 2018 and amounted to USD 70.5 million. Such dynamics was primarily determined by a decrease in the exports of large commodity items “garments, women’s and girls’ knitted or crocheted goods” (by USD 40.9 million) and “garments, men’s and boys’ knitted or crocheted goods” (by USD 21.4 million). The decline in the export value of the aforementioned items was a consequence of a decrease in the physical volume and average prices of supplies. Insignificant changes were observed in the exports for other commodity items of the group.

Growth in the gross output of the agricultural products compared to the corresponding period of 2018 was mainly due to increased production in the livestock and crop-growing sectors⁶. At the same time, goods of crop-growing sector prevailed in the commodity structure of agricultural exports. Thus, among large commodity items, there was an increase in the export supplies of vegetables (by USD 17.8 million), fruits and nuts (by USD 7.1 million), oils and other fats derived from milk (by USD 7.1 million). At the same time, a decrease was observed in the export of sugar, syrup and honey (by USD 9.7 million) and live animals (by USD 2.1 million).

During nine months of 2019, the share of non-EAEU countries was 67.0 percent (58.5 percent during nine months of 2018) **in the geographic structure of exports**. In the reporting period, goods were primarily exported to Great Britain (61.8 percent of the total exports to the non-EAEU countries). In the reporting period, Uzbekistan, Turkey, China and Tajikistan were other large partners of the Kyrgyz Republic among the non-EAEU countries. Goods of the processing sector and agricultural products were mainly supplied to these countries.

In the reporting period of 2019, export of goods to the EAEU countries amounted to USD 449.1 million, which resulted in a reduction in the share thereof from 37.9 percent to 33.0 percent of the total volume of exported goods. Agricultural products and goods of the processing sector prevail among the goods exported to the EAEU countries. The goods were primarily exported to the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Russian Federation, the share thereof in the total volume of exports to the EAEU countries was 55.1 and 42.9 percent, respectively.

Imports of goods in FOB prices according to the results of nine months of 2019 amounted to USD 3,423.8 million, having decreased by 7.1 percent as opposed to the same indicator of nine months of 2018.

Supplies of goods from the group “manufactured goods classified by material” amounted to USD 861.4 million in the commodity structure of imports. The value of imports of this commodity group increased by 7.2 percent compared to January-September 2018 due to growth in supplies of goods on the items “metalwork equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 42.9 million), “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 23.2 million) and “doors, door frames and doorsteps” (by USD 14.2 million). Meanwhile, a significant reduction in imports was observed on some large goods items. In particular, there was a decrease in imports of woven fabrics made of man-made textile materials (by USD 68.5 million), rubber tires (by USD 5.6 million), iron and steel (by USD 4.6 million).

Import value of the group “machines and transportation equipment” increased by 3.0 percent and amounted to USD 792.6 million in the reporting period. In the goods structure of this group, there was the most significant increase in supplies on the items “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 62.4 million), “machines for sorting and screening earth, stone, ores; and parts thereof” (by USD 12.0 million) and “batteries and electric accumulators, and parts thereof” (by USD 9.6 million). At the same time, there was a decrease in imports on the items “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of persons” (by USD 7.6 million), “motor vehicles for the transport of goods and special purpose motor vehicles” (by USD 3.9 million) and other items.

During nine months of 2019, imports of goods in the group “various manufactured products” decreased by 35.4 percent and amounted to USD 565.4 million. The items “articles of apparel and clothing accessories” and “footwear” demonstrated the largest significant decrease: the value of imports of these goods decreased by USD 158.6 million and USD 119.0 million, respectively. Insignificant changes were observed in the imports value for other commodity items of the group.

In January-September 2019, imports of goods in the group “mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials” decreased by 18.2 percent compared to the same period of 2018 and amounted to USD 508.2 million. Petroleum products still have the main share among the imported products of this group. In the reporting period, the value of imports of petroleum products decreased by 18.7 percent and amounted to USD 464.2 million. There was a decrease in the supplies of gasoline (by USD 54.1 million), diesel fuel (by USD 50.2 million), kerosene (by USD 10.5 million) and other petroleum products (by USD 8.9 million). At the same time, there was an increase in the supplies of fuel oil and lubricants by USD 11.6 million and USD 5.6 million, respectively.

There was a decrease in the share of goods imported from the non-EAEU countries from 60.4 to 58.4 percent **in the geographic structure** of import due to a reduction in the supplies of consumer goods. China remains the key trading partner of the Kyrgyz Republic among the non-CIS countries, the share thereof was 61.5 percent of the total imports from the non-EAEU countries in the reporting period. Turkey (7.8 percent) and Uzbekistan (7.1 percent) are other leading foreign trade partners among the non-EAEU countries.

In the reporting period, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries slightly increased and amounted to 41.6 percent (39.6 percent during nine months of 2018). Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation, still prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. Broad list of consumer goods were supplied to the Kyrgyz Republic besides energy carriers.



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES


Improvement in the balance of transport services and travel caused a positive balance on the item "services".

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the balance of the item "travel" was formed positive in the amount of USD 238.3 million, having increased by 2.0 times, due to growth of services related to travels of the citizens from the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic by 45.1 percent. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) increased by 16.4 percent.

The balance of transport services in the reporting period was formed negative in the amount of USD 151.1 million, having decreased by 31.2 percent compared to the same indicator of nine months of 2018. At the same time, there was an increase in the export of transport services by 17.7 percent (mainly due to the growth of air and road transport services), whereas, the volume of import transactions decreased by 10.8 percent (also due to road and air transport services).

Net export of business services for the reporting period was formed positive in the amount of USD 28.3 million, meanwhile during the same period of 2018 this indicator was formed negative in the amount of USD 13.5 million. In the reporting year, the main factor that affected the change in the balance of business services was an increase in the exports of services in the mining and consulting sectors.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the turnover of international services increased by 18.8 percent and constituted USD 1,619.5 million.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, **balance of international services** was positive and amounted to USD 147.3 million; meanwhile, the balance of services was negative in the amount of USD 94.2 million in the comparable period of 2018. Such dynamics was the result of the outstripping growth in exports of services (by 39.2 percent) compared to the volume of services provided by the non-residents (an increase by 1.0 percent).

In the reporting period, **exports of services** constituted USD 883.4 million, which corresponded to 62.9 percent of exports of goods. **Imports of services** were in the amount of USD 736.1 million, which constituted 21.5 percent of imports of goods.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the main services were travel, transport and business services, which in total constituted 88.6 percent of the turnover of international services.

INCOME

Dynamics of the item “income” in the reporting year was defined mainly by the change in the volume of direct investment income.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the balance of the item “income” was formed negative in the amount of USD 434.3 million, against USD 172.8 million at the end of nine months of 2018. This trend is mainly caused by the increase in the incomes of direct foreign investors due to growth in the volume of the enterprises’ reinvested profit up to USD 172.5 million and distributed income in the form of dividends up to USD 204.2 million. As a result, at the end of nine months of 2019, the income of the non-residents on direct investments amounted to USD 378.5 million.


In the reporting period, the volume of interest payments on the previously received loans increased by 11.5 percent and amounted to USD 64.7 million mainly due to interest payments on the private sector loans. In general, this contributed to increasing the deficit of the item “income on other investments” by 27.6 percent (up to USD 46.6 million).

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 9.3 million and decreased by 9.1 percent due to a reduction in the total incomes of the non-residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

TRANSFERS

The volume of current transfer inflows was formed below the level of last year due to a decrease in money transfers of labor migrants.

decrease in the net inflow of money transfers was due to a decline in the gross inflow thereof by 9.8 percent, meanwhile the outflow of money transfers decreased by 1.5 percent.

Positive balance of **current transfers** according to the results of nine months of 2019 constituted USD 1,581.2 million, having decreased by 9.9 percent compared to the same indicator in the corresponding period of 2018. Official and private transfers (other sectors) affected the current transfer account.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, the money transfers of labor migrants have the main value, the specific weight of which in the gross volume of private transfers constitutes 98.9 percent. In the reporting period, a

Money transfer systems⁷ remain the main mode of the labor migrants' remittances to the country. During nine months of 2019, the net volume of funds received through money transfer systems constituted USD 1,780.3 million⁸, having decreased by 9.7 percent compared to the same indicator in the corresponding period of 2018. The volume of remittances transferred from the country decreased by 1.4 percent and constituted USD 383.1 million. The geographic structure of money transfers remains almost unchanged. According to the results of the reporting period, the main share of money transfers was received from the Russian Federation (98.0 percent). In the structure of transfers sent from the Kyrgyz Republic, the prevailing specific weight also falls on the Russian Federation (99.1 percent).

Remittances remain the main source of trade deficit financing. The balance of remittances still covers net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value of USD 1,117.9 million.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the balance of current transfers in **the sector of state governance** increased and was formed positive in the amount of USD 28.1 million. Growth in inflows of official transfers up to USD 32.2 million was due to an increase in the volume of cash grants received by the public sector.



CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS ACCOUNT

In the reporting period, the decrease in the balance of the capital and financial account was due to the effect of the high base in the last year. There was an increase in the flow of funds on the financial account.

Federation in the first quarter of 2018, which significantly increased the positive balance of the capital account in the basic period.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the **financial account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 193.7 million, having increased by USD 108.0 million compared to nine months of 2018. The financial account experienced major impact of the items “direct investments” and “other investments”.

In the reporting period, the balance of the item “direct investments” was formed positive and amounted to USD 61.3 million, against USD 18.5 million according to the results of nine months of 2018. This trend was mainly due to an increase in direct investments to the Kyrgyz Republic as a result of growth in the volume of reinvested profit up to USD 172.5 million. In the reporting period, the volume of financial assets invested in the share capital was formed with a negative value in the amount of USD 11.4 million. The volume of financial assets invested in other capital was formed negative in the amount of USD 97.7 million, mainly due to an increase in payments on the principal amount of loans received by the direct investment enterprises from the foreign co-owners.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the volume of funds received on the item “other investments” amounted to USD 102.2 million, having increased by USD 25.3 million compared to the indicator of nine months of 2018. In general, in the reporting period, there was an increase in foreign assets and liabilities of the residents to the non-residents.

During nine months of 2019, the assets of the residents increased by USD 186.5 million. The growth of the commercial banks’ assets in cash and deposits on the foreign accounts and the increase in the volume of resident enterprises’ accounts receivable had the main impact on the assets dynamics. As of the end of nine months of 2019, in total, more than 80.0 percent of the gross volume of accounts receivable fell on the enterprises that are engaged in the processing, professional, scientific and technical activity, as well as in the wholesale and retail trade. In the reporting period, the volume of funds deposited on the accounts of the residents in foreign banks increased by USD 1.8 million.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the liabilities to the non-residents increased by USD 288.7 million. In the reporting period, the net inflow of loans to the public and private sectors was formed with a positive balance and amounted to USD 173.5 million. At the same time, the net outflow of funds in the amount of USD 4.7 million (during nine months of 2018, the indicator amounted to USD 256.5 million⁹) was observed on loans to the public sector due to the excess of payments on the main amount of debt over the volume of loans received by the public sector in the reporting period. The volume

According to the results of nine months of 2019, the **capital and financial account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 258.3 million, having decreased by 34.4 percent compared to the corresponding indicator of 2018.

In the reporting period, the positive balance of the **capital account** decreased down to USD 64.6 million. The aforementioned decrease in the indicator was due to the debt in the amount of USD 240.0 million written off by the Russian

of loans received by the private sector (USD 412.5 million) exceeded the amount of repayments on the main amount of debt (USD 234.3 million), as a result, the net volume of private sector loans was formed with a positive balance in the amount USD 178.2 million. In the reporting period, the commercial banks' liabilities in the form of the non-residents' cash and deposits increased by USD 42.9 million.

In the reporting period, the volume of the resident enterprises' accounts payable increased by USD 72.3 million, which is 57.8 percent lower compared to nine months of 2018. In general, the prevailing share in total accounts payable fell on the enterprises operating in the field of wholesale and retail trade, processing and mining industry, information and communications to make more than 80.0 percent of the total amount of debt.

According to the results of nine months of 2019, **the overall net balance of payments** was formed negative in the amount of USD 75.1 million.

The balance of the item "errors and omissions", taking into account the additional estimates of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic, was formed positive in the amount of USD 392.6 million. The volume of the gross international reserve assets as of the end of nine months of 2019 constituted USD 2,285.7 million, which covered 4.7 months¹⁰ of the future import of goods and services.

Transfer to methodology according to the 6th Edition of the Balance of Payments and International Investment Position Manual

Currently, the balance of payments statistics is compiled by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in accordance with the requirements of the International Monetary Fund's Balance of Payments Manual, the fifth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM5). However, in order to provide compliance of the external sector statistics methodology with the new international standards, the National Bank takes measures on compiling the balance of payments statistics based on the IMF's new methodology – the Balance of Payments Manual, the sixth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM6).

This box provides the users with the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic (analytical form), as well as international investment position of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled on the basis of the BPM6 methodology.

Given that the BPM6 has a high degree of continuity with the methodology of the BPM5, the balance of payments statistics which are based on the new methodology generally remain comparable with the data compiled according the methodology of the BPM5. At the same time, the meaning of the balance of payments accounts changed as some items of the balance of payments were regrouped in accordance with the BPM6.

The main changes in the accounting system for transactions in the BPM6 as compared to the BPM5 are given in Table 1.

List of Amendments in Accounts of the Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic according to the BPM6 methodology

Goods

According to the BPM6 methodological requirements, the item “Goods” underwent significant changes, which affected the form of this account’s presentation, regrouping of items and differentiation of individual goods due to their special role in the financial markets. Thus, the following components are recommended to be reflected in the item “Goods”: *export/import of goods according the balance of payments methodology, net exports of goods under merchanting, non-monetary gold.*

In adapting the balance of goods of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic with the requirements of the BPM6, the following amendments were made:

- export/import of goods and non-monetary gold are introduced as the main components;
- re-export is defined separately as an additional item in the export of goods;
- goods procured in ports by carriers are included in the item of export/import of goods, meanwhile, according to the BPM5 such goods were defined as a separate item under goods;
- migrants’ personal effects are not included in the item of export/import of goods and are not reflected in any other balance of payments accounts, as according to a new interpretation, this concept is not classified as an operation;
- goods acquired to be processed, goods sent abroad for repair are excluded from the item “Goods”, because there is no transfer of ownership for the goods between a resident and a non-resident in accordance with the BPM6 methodology.

Services

Significant amendments were not introduced in the general concept of accounting the international services in the balance of payments. The main adjustments according to the new BPM6 include clarification in the procedure and methodology of accounting for several indicators, as well as rearrangement or renaming of the sections and particular items on services account to bring the services account in line with the conceptual framework of the System of National Accounts (SNA 2008) and the Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services (UN, 2011).

The following adjustments on the service account of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic were made in order to bring it in line with the BPM6 methodology:

- a new item “Manufacturing services on physical inputs owned by others”, which includes only the fee charged by an entity that does not own the goods and engaged in the processing of material resources, was introduced in the section of services;
- postal and courier services (previously recorded in the item “Communication services”) are included in the item “Transport services”;
- the item “Construction services” was renamed in “Construction”, which mainly reflects the fact that the construction works, as well as the goods and services purchased by a non-resident

enterprise that is building in the country where construction activities are carried out, are accounted in this item. The construction is divided into “construction abroad” and “construction in the Kyrgyz Republic”;

- the item “Royalties and license payments” (previously reflected in the item “Business services”), according to the BPM6 methodology was renamed and represents a separate item entitled “Charges for the use of intellectual property, not classified in other categories”;
- a new item, that combines telecommunication services (previously recorded in the item “Communication services”) with computer and information services, which previously represented a separate item, was introduced.

Primary income

To ensure consistency between the accounts of foreign economic activity and the national accounts, the item “Income” and its components are brought into line with the item “Primary income account” of the SNA 2008. A detailed breakdown of the investment income is introduced; this breakdown allows linking it with the functional and instrumental classifications of the financial instruments. At the same time, generally, the indicators of the item remain comparable with the data compiled using the BPM5 methodology.

Secondary income

In general, the conceptual framework for accounting current transfers in the balance of payments did not change significantly and maintained continuity with the BPM5 methodology. According to the BPM6 methodological requirements, the item “Current transfers” was renamed into “Secondary income”. More detailed classification of the types of current transfers is provided; certain definitions and procedures of accounting for particular sub-items of the secondary income account are clarified and distinguished.

Financial account

Generally, the basic principles for compiling a financial account according to the BPM6 did not change. The new methodology clarifies the concepts of direct investment, which were brought in line with the fourth edition of the “OECD Benchmark Definition of Foreign Direct Investment”. In particular, the definitions of control and influence, the recording methods of the investment chains and fellow enterprises, as well as presentation of assets and liabilities on the gross basis and in accordance with the principle of direction were revised. Functional and instrumental categories of the financial account were expanded and supplemented.

In the course of bringing in compliance with the BPM6 requirements, the following amendments were introduced into the financial account of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic (except for the amendments related to the column names and the interpretation of signs related to the financial account reflected in Table 1):

- name of the item “Reinvested instruments” in direct investments, according to the BPM6 methodology, was renamed to “Reinvestment of earnings”, in order to separate it from the corresponding item on the primary income account;
- credits provided directly to the suppliers of goods and services, as well as advances and prepayments to the customer for goods and services accounted in the item “Accounts receivable and payable” according to the BPM5, are included in the item “Trade credit and advances”. Moreover, other debts that are not classified as trade credits and advances or other instruments of the financial account are included in the item “other accounts payable/ receivable”;
- other equity instruments not classified as direct investments are included in “other investments” as a separate item;

- liabilities in arrears is still reflected in the original instrument until liquidation of obligation, meanwhile, according to the BPM5, the old liability was assumed to have been repaid and a new one was created instead and that such contingent transaction was reflected in the item “Other assets/other liabilities”.

In addition to the amendments mentioned above, the National Bank will continue to work on further clarifying and improving the statistical recording of the balance of payments accounts in accordance with the BPM6 methodological requirements.

Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices


